1. INTRODUCTION

The Introduction must move logically from general context to specific research aim.

- 1.1. Background of the Study: Present contextual and theoretical foundations.
- 1.2. State of the Art: Critically synthesize recent high-impact literature.
- 1.3. Gap Analysis and Novelty: Identify unresolved problems and contribution.
- 1.4. Research Objectives and/or Hypotheses: Clearly stated and logically aligned..

2. METHODS

The Methods section must enable replication and critical evaluation.

2.1. Research Design

Specify and justify design: Experimental, Quasi-experimental, Survey, Case Study, Phenomenology, Ethnography, Grounded Theory, Mixed Methods, etc.

2.2. Participants and Sampling

Describe population, sampling technique, sample size, inclusion criteria, context, and setting.

2.3. Instruments / Data Collection Tools

Quantitative: Describe instruments, scale development, validity (construct/content), reliability (α , CR).

Qualitative: Describe interview protocols, observation guides, document analysis procedures.

Mixed: Explain integration strategy.

2.4. Data Collection Procedure

Explain step-by-step procedures, timeline, and ethical considerations.

2.5. Data Analysis

Quantitative: Specify statistical tests (t-test, ANOVA, regression, SEM), effect size, assumptions testing.

Qualitative: Explain coding process (open, axial, selective), thematic analysis, triangulation.

Mixed: Explain integration and meta-inference strategy.

2.6. Trustworthiness / Validity Assurance

Quantitative: Validity, reliability, normality, multicollinearity.

Qualitative: Credibility, transferability, dependability, confirmability.

2.7. Methodological Limitations

Clarify design constraints and scope boundaries.

3. RESULTS

Present analyzed data only.

Quantitative: Report descriptive and inferential statistics (M, SD, effect size, CI).

Qualitative: Present themes/subthemes with representative excerpts.

Mixed: Present integrated findings logically.

No interpretation beyond reporting.

4. DISCUSSION

The Discussion section interprets and contextualizes the findings.

1. Interpretation of Findings.
2. Comparison with Prior Research.
3. Theoretical Contribution.
4. Practical/Policy Implications.
5. Limitations.
6. Future Research Directions.

Ensure analytical depth without overstating findings.

5. CONCLUSIONS

The conclusion must:

- Directly answer research objectives.
- Synthesize key contributions.
- Emphasize theoretical and/or practical relevance.
- Avoid introducing new arguments or data.

Written in paragraph form (not bullet points).

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Briefly acknowledge institutional, technical, or individual contributions that do not meet authorship criteria.

Do not include funding information here.

FUNDING STATEMENT

Clearly state funding sources, grant numbers, and the role of the funder.

If none:

This research received no external funding.

ETHICS STATEMENT

State ethical approval information (if applicable), including:

- Institutional Review Board approval
- Informed consent procedures

If not applicable, provide justification.

DATA AVAILABILITY STATEMENT

Specify one of the following:

- Data publicly available (include repository link).

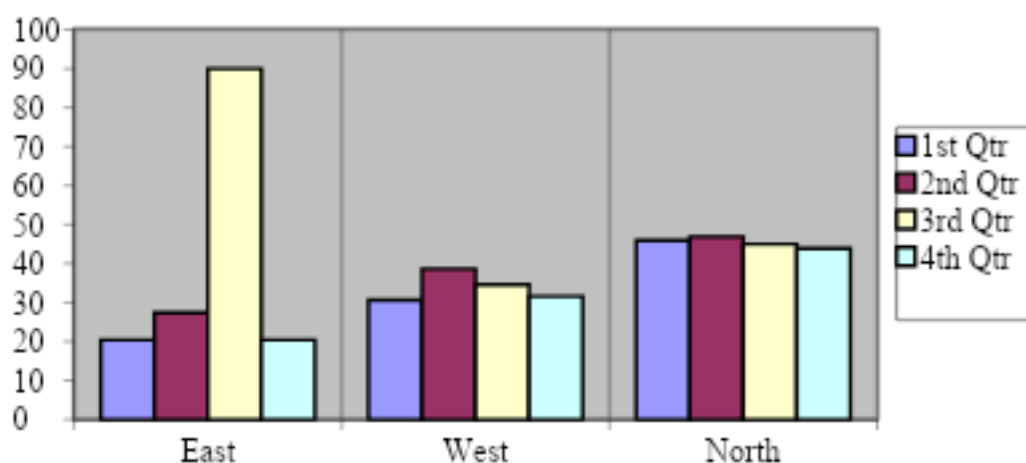
