About this list: The following is a list of resources the Arts & Climate CA* research team identified during the Bay Area assessment phase of the project. This list is not comprehensive and represents a snapshot in time of resources active as of March 2025 that Arts & Climate CA felt were relevant to the Bay Area arts and culture community interested in learning about and engaging in the growing movement in the cultural sector taking action on climate change.

*Arts & Climate CA is a research project addressing the lack of information on California's cultural sector's climate related needs. It started its assessment in the Bay Area, identifying the climate change needs of the region's cultural sector who serve frontline communities with the goal of contributing to better climate change resiliency and connecting the sector to existing resources to support this work.

Community Gathering + Learning Resources

- Bay Area
 - San Jose Climate Art Program: Helping San José reach carbon neutrality through arts and culture by 2030. Its <u>Carbon Neutral Creative Network</u> program is focused on environmental and sustainability resilience, which involves fostering connections between organizations, businesses, and individuals who are passionate about using the arts to promote environmental protection and sustainability. This network can serve as a platform for collaboration, knowledge sharing, innovation, advocacy, leading to the development of creative solutions to environmental challenges.
 - Art + Climate Action: Art + Climate Action is a San Francisco Bay Area collective dedicated to building a sustainable art world. A+CA unites museums, galleries, non-profit arts spaces, studios, art advisors, and arts patrons to better understand our sector's climate impacts and create the environmentally conscious arts community we need.

Its program, <u>Climate Woke</u> centers the intersection of Black Liberation and Indigenous Sovereignty for global energy transition. It fosters creative activism in media through recognizing the historical resilience of Black and Indigenous communities of color in facing crises through cultural practices.

 uses less, recycles more, and takes resource conservation to higher and higher levels.
- <u>Emerald Cities Collaborative:</u> Emerald Cities Collaborative (ECC) is a national nonprofit
 network of organizations working together to advance a sustainable environment while
 creating sustainable, just and inclusive economies with opportunities for all an
 approach they call "the high road."

ECC's Northern California team is partnering with Ava Community Energy on the Community Organizing and Capacity Building for Resilience Hubs program, which aims to understand the needs and opportunities for community-driven resilience hubs in Alameda & San Joaquin Counties.
