Ethics

- You can't judge the ethics of a situation without *considering the situation*.
- Morals and ethics are about deciding how to behave or act when there are other beings to consider, because your actions may affect each other. The greatest results come from maximizing good and minimizing evil, where good is well-being and evil is harm, and both are about physical, mental, financial and environmental health.
- Principles can turn a slippery slope for others into a stable position.
- All consent is informed consent or it's not actually consent. If you consent to A and get B, even if it's just slightly different from A, one can't reasonably say you consented to B.
