<u>Learning Module #6 - Showcase Write Up</u> <u>Kayleigh Steckel and Addison Wood</u> Block F

Goals:

The goal of planning the computer science showcase was to inspire and encourage
Warren Hills students to take a computer science class during their highschool career.
Addison and Kayleigh wanted to properly reflect everything CS@WH and computer
science has to offer while also setting up their classmates to share the amazing
projects they created this year.

Addison's Accomplishments and Problems:

- Addison's biggest accomplishment was successfully putting together the showcase in a way that has never been done before. She was extremely proud of being able to help change the showcase in a way that she felt represented the hands-on aspect of computer science that she feels is sometimes overlooked.
- Addison's biggest problem was being too close minded and letting her other stresses
 overwhelm her. Addison sometimes lost sight of the matter at hand and became
 difficult to work with and seemed stand offish to other ideas. After taking a step back
 from the situation and talking about her feelings, she realized the light of the situation
 and was able to step back up and work together with Kayleigh and Mr. Detrick to put
 together the showcase.

Kayleigh's Accomplishments and Problems:

- Kayleigh's biggest accomplishment was feeling like she left an impact on some of the
 people who attended the showcase. She saw people being interested when Addison
 and herself spoke at the beginning of each block, and these students maintained
 interest throughout the showcase when they went around to go see projects. A lot of
 the middle school students seemed engaged, and Kayleigh hopes that the showcase
 that she and Addison put together will inspire them to take CS classes in the future.
- Kayleigh's biggest problem was her own time management and motivation throughout the process of planning. She often times wasn't really operating at 100% and tended to be focused on other things. In the future, Kayleigh intends to maintain

more focus on the tasks at hand, be more motivated, and be more helpful throughout the planning process. Although Kayleigh struggled to fully be her best throughout the module, it all came together very nicely and she believes that she and Addison have a lot to be proud of.

Learned:

• Addison and Kayleigh learned how to successfully plan and facilitate a showcase and engage over one hundred people at a time. They learned how to properly schedule events, work on public speaking, work on communication with adults and peers, and also implement new ideas by thinking outside of the box. Addison also learned how to limit micromanagement and put her trust in her peers and others to follow through with a job. Kayleigh learned the value of being paired up with someone who has different strengths than you— she felt as though her and Addison worked well together and balanced each other out throughout the learning module.

Future Learning Modules

For those who plan the computer science showcase in the future, Addison and
Kayleigh highly recommend following through with the interactive set up of the
computer science showcase. While it does put more pressure on the students to
present multiple times, it was statistically proven from our surveys that more
students retained the information when given the chance to get up and interact with
the projects.

Summary of Addison and Kayleigh's Experience

• Overall, Kayleigh and Addison found this project to be very enjoyable. While there were some stressful aspects of the planning process— there were a lot of moving parts— they found fulfillment in the work. Between doing the showcase with an entirely new setup and figuring out classes and scheduling, at times Addison and Kayleigh felt a bit overwhelmed. But, it was all worth it on the day of the showcase. The pair felt a lot of satisfaction in seeing a positive impact on their peers. Teachers, advanced topics students, and the students attending the showcase all gave great feedback on the surveys they received. Overall, Kayleigh and Addison feel as though the day was a success and they have a lot to be proud of.

IN SCHOOL:

January 8th , 2025 - Block F Kayleigh and Addison

Day 1:

Today, Kayleigh and Addison outlined what blocks the showcase will be run during. They obtained a list of math teachers from Mr. Detrick and began deciding what classes will be asked to be in attendance. Tomorrow they plan to finalize the math teachers and approach them to confirm attendance.
