Support and Assessment Strategies

- 1. Observe together a veteran colleague; discuss afterwards
- 2. **Arrange** for the new teacher to observe another teacher
- 3. Model a class meeting
- 4. **Review** key points in a new teaching strategy
- 5. Co-teach
- 6. Share an effective strategy for engaging diverse students
- 7. **Draw attention** to student behaviors and comments
- 8. Collect and analyze together observation data
- 9. **Ask questions** that examine issues of equity
- 10. Videotape a lesson for reflection
- 11. Co-develop standards for student behavior
- 12. Co-plan routines and procedures
- 13. Provide sample discipline policies
- 14. Brainstorm ways to build student cooperation and responsibility
- 15. Role-play a problematic student interaction
- 16. **Assist** with arranging the room
- 17. Provide a lesson plan
- 18. Analyze how best to meet the needs of special population students
- 19. Offer strategies for working with English Language Learners
- 20. Inquire about possible challenges in a planned lesson
- 21. Examine together district frameworks or curriculum standards
- 22. **Encourage** the teacher to try out a new strategy
- 23. Connect the teacher with veteran colleagues for content-specific resources
- 24. Attend together a workshop
- 25. **Discuss** together how a strategy might impact student content learning
- 26. **Analyze** student work together
- 27. Listen as the teacher discusses examples of student work
- 28. Role-play a parent conference
- 29. Co-develop differentiated assessments
- 30. Assist with preparing report cards
- 31. Encourage a teacher to share a successful lesson at a grade-level meeting
- 32. **Explain** site traditions/culture, procedures and protocols
- 33. Ask questions that help the new teacher prioritize issues/concerns
- 34. **Invite** the teacher to share a 'success for the day'
- 35. Identify the strong points in a lesson design
- 36. Encourage the teacher to seek a balance between professional and personal demands.
