

Reich, Wilhelm. *The Mass Psychology of Fascism: (3. Print.)*, 1971.

I thought it was essential to include Wilhelm Reich's *The Mass Psychology of Fascism* because I wanted to understand how pathological group identities are formed when they are not related to ethnic identities. Reich's book illuminates how those who have inhibited (sexual Freudian) drives are susceptible to authoritarian and nationalistic sentiments. Mysticism (religion) and patriarchal family structures help the state suppress these drives, which help create a critical mass of followers for the fascist state.

I am only assigning the introduction, which explains group identities in terms of sex-economy sociology.
