Meet the Teacher

High School

- Freshmen and New Student Orientation Tuesday, August 15 Incoming freshmen and new students in grades 10-12 are to report to the Knights Center at 8:00 a.m. This mandatory orientation program will provide you with an opportunity to meet other students and your teachers, to become familiar with the campus, and to run through your schedule. Students must be in uniform; lunch will be provided, and the day will end at noon.
- High School First Day of School Wednesday, August 16 All high school students will have their first day of school on Wednesday, August 16. This will be a Late Start Day for high school, beginning at 8:55 a.m. and ending at 2:50 p.m. School pictures and ID photos will be taken during the school day. - Part-time K meets from 8:10 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday except for Late Start on Wednesdays, 9:00 a.m. to 2:50 p.m.
- Classical Hybrid K-8th grade meets from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm every Tuesday and Friday
- High school students attend classes from 7:55 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. except for Late Start on Wednesdays, 8:55 a.m. to 2:50 p.m.

GENERAL INFORMATION

School Pictures

- K-5 Students Pictures of K-5 students will be taken on <u>August 23</u> and students must be in school uniform. Ordering information will be sent home the first week.
- Middle School pictures and ID photos will be taken on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 15</u>. Order forms will be available Monday at Meet the Teacher Night (check/cash/credit card accepted). Information will be sent prior to this day to allow you to pre-order pictures online.
- **High School** pictures and ID photos will be taken on <u>Wednesday</u>. August 16 during the school day. Ordering information will be sent by email prior to the first week of school.
- Preschool- Pictures will be taken on November 2.

School Lunches

K-8 Students have the option to bring their own lunch or order from the **Knights Corner Kitchen Too**. This school-owned food service will provide a hot lunch that must be <u>pre-ordered</u> through your <u>FACTS Family portal</u> for the cost of \$6.00 for each lunch. - In order to avoid technical difficulties, please place lunch orders using a computer, not using your cell phone. Lunch orders are to be placed the night before, not the same day.
- Lunch orders placed same day will result in an E-Lunch from the office (\$6.00)
- Reimbursements will be made **only** for sick absences.
- A call to the Kitchen must be made by 9 a.m. for lunch reimbursement for said absence.
- Pre-ordered lunches will not be reimbursed for Classroom Parties or Field Trips.
- No switching of days is allowed.

High School Students The Knights Corner Kitchen (KCK) is a cashless system. Parents will need to preload money through FACTS by way of their family portal. Find instructions here. Students will be given a student ID with a barcode, and the ID card will be used to make purchases from the KCK. Note: Student ID must be used to make purchases. Please monitor your balance closely as it is very difficult for us to prevent students from overdrawing their account. Entrees will be \$7.00, and we will still offer fresh salads, fruits, snacks, and beverages.

Drop-Off and Pick Up

- Elementary and Middle School Campus
 - All students will drop off at the front of campus (Euclid Avenue).
 - Students with last names beginning with A-L will pick up at the front of campus (Euclid Avenue), and students with last names M-Z will pick up at the staff parking lot located off of Cedar. RIGHT turns only into the parking lot.
 - Please note that drop-off and pick-up procedures are subject to change as deemed necessary. Any changes to this process will be communicated via email to families.
- High School Campus Drop Off Please enter at the west driveway on Philadelphia Street and exit at the east driveway. Please note: morning drop off in the Knights Center lot is not permitted.
- High School Student Parking: Student parking is available for a fee of \$10 per year. Seniors
 and juniors receive parking assignments before other students, and applications can be
 found here.

Immunizations, Physicals and Medications

According to California statute, students enrolling in California public and private schools must present documentation that immunization and current health requirements have been met*.

Health Examination

- California law requires a health examination prior to school entry
- All currently enrolled students will need to have a physical health examination on file with the school prior to 1st grade entry

 All newly enrolled students will need to submit proof of health examination before attending classes

<u>Immunizations</u>

- California list of <u>required immunizations</u>
- A copy of the Tdap immunization is required for any student attending the 7th grade
- Students may not attend classes until proof of the required immunizations are met and submitted to our office*

For returning students please make sure all medical records are up to date in the office.

*Proof of immunization and a recent physical must be in the school office before August 7th, 2023.

Medications

All students requiring the use of medication, both over the counter and/or prescription, during school hours must provide a doctor's note/order AND written parental consent. The doctor's note/order must include the student's name, name of medication, time to be given, amount to be taken and route in which to take it by. In addition to a doctor's note, written parental consent is also required. Forms for parental consent may be picked up in the elementary office during normal business hours. All medications must be stored in the health office and not in student's backpacks, bags or pockets, for safety purposes. With the start of school, please update changes to key information in your <u>FACTS Family portal</u>, such as cell phone numbers, addresses, medical information, and emergency contacts. **This important information is essential during the course of the school year.** Please complete the update by the end of August.

Online School Directory

Ontario Christian uses an online directory in the <u>FACTS Family portal</u> that is available for all OC parents to view. During the online enrollment, parents chose to be a part of the online school directory. To make changes to the directory, please log into your FACTS Family portal, click Web Forms and select WebForms. Under 'Custodial Parent', select the Custodial Parent Form next to the parent's name and scroll to the bottom. Changes must be the same for both parents in the household if you choose to block your information.

Dress Code

Dennis uniforms are required <u>including on the first day of school</u>. Finances

OC partners with FACTS Management Company to manage our tuition program. FACTS will be communicating with you 5 days before a payment is to be processed by the preference (email or postal mail) you chose at the time of enrollment. FACTS will also invoice for incidental billing for such things as class fees, special events, athletic spirit packs, overnight field trips, etc. Watch for invoices from FACTS in regards to these bills. You can choose to have these invoices automatically deducted using the same payment method as your tuition. Extended Care - Kindergarten Through 8th Grade

Extended care for students is offered on the elementary campus before and after school. Schedules

- The last day to make any schedule changes will be Wednesday, August 23. After that deadline, schedules are final.

PE Dress Code

<u>Uniforms are required for physical education classes for students in grades 6-12.</u> One set is provided to a student new to OCS; additional sets may be purchased from the PE department at a cost of \$25 per set, or shirts at \$10 and shorts at \$15.

Athletic Participation and Physicals

All students participating on a middle or high school athletic team must have a current sports physical on file. Sports physicals can be obtained offsite from your primary care physician or an authorized medical provider. Please print out and bring the OCS-Sports Physical Form with you to your appointment. Additional information on obtaining athletic clearance can be found here. The athletic physical is good for one calendar year. Please complete the athletic clearance procedures by your first practice or the date as communicated by your coach.

Athletics for middle school students include boys & girls cross country, girls volleyball and boys flag football, boys & girls basketball, boys & girls soccer, boys & girls track, baseball, and softball. Information will be provided regarding practice times, etc., shortly after school begins.
