Field Supervisor Duties

At All Times

Being an ambassador for SMLLA at Trinta Park. Meet, greet, and be kind.

Prior to a Game

- Check in umpires
- Issue ball/strike counters, plate brushes and balls to umpires.
- Make certain that ALL Managers and coaches on the field during a game are badged (they do not have to be wearing the badge). Those not badged are not allowed on the field and should be asked nicely to leave the field.
- Minors through Majors: Only three (3) Managers & Coaches allowed on the field per team.
- Single A & California League: Four (4) Managers & Coaches allowed on the field per team.
- T-Ball: Up to Five (5) Managers & Coaches allowed on the field per team.

Start of the Game

Making certain that games start on time. Inadequate time between games for whatever reason is no excuse for the next game starting on time. Keep games on schedule.

During the Game

- Be on hand to help facilitate calls made by umpires. Help the umpire walk through what transpired during the play and help him/her make the right call.
- Be on hand to help moderate hostile behavior between parents, coaches or managers. Only the Manager is allowed to address the Umpire. NOT THE COACHES.
- Monitor comments coming from the stands that are directed to players and umpires. Only positive comments are allowed.
- REMEDY: Use life skills to approach a manager, coach or parent that is utilizing poor judgment and nicely remind them that we are dealing with a Little League baseball game and kids are present.
- If your efforts do not work, simply call San Mateo Police or the San Mateo Park Ranger to have the individual(s) removed from the premises.
- Personal Threats: To a Field Supervisor, Manager, Coach, Umpire or Spectator: call San Mateo Police to have the individual(s) removed from the premises immediately.

Safety

- Be sure fans, coaches, umpires, and players are following <u>COVID-19 guidelines</u> (masking, social distancing, etc.)
- Making certain that common areas are kept safe from bat swinging and ball throwing.
- Making certain that catchers warming up a pitcher are wearing at a minimum, a catcher's helmet and that there is a spotter is in place. Catcher cannot be an adult. Spotter can be a

player or an adult. Adults are not allowed to warm up pitchers at all levels of play in Little League.

- Be on hand to administer first aid or call 911 in case of an emergency. The first aid kit and ice packs are stored in the green container and snack shack.
- Do not hesitate to call San Mateo Police or the San Mateo Park Ranger if you notice suspicious activity at Trinta Park.
- Please make sure that smoking and alcohol are not being used or consumed on premise.
