- A. Try to find different types of materials. How easy is it to find what you need? This is an easy to use website. The different types of OER materials are all organized by subject which is nicely arranged on the left-hand side of the webpage with sub-categories within the main subject heading, so I found English under Arts.
- B. Is the repository geared towards certain disciplines, types of content, types of courses, etc.?

The repository seems to be geared to all disciplines with links to the textbooks. One thing that is helpful is how it states if the text has been faculty-reviewed, adopted, or has ancillary material. Something I find interesting is the more I look into OER materials is the lack of ancillaries I seem to come upon.

C. What are the advantages and disadvantages of the repository?

The only disadvantage I see is that there may not be enough materials for a particular discipline. As I am looking for an introduction to literature OER, the only resources I found focused on very old types of literature. There is nothing contemporary. This may be because of the copyright limitations.

One very big advantage of this website is this repository clearly delineates whether materials can be edited or not. See graphic below. This is very helpful.
