Will anyone in the church, will any past members, any pastors stand up and seek the truth ... or ... will all those Christians put their heads in the sand and allow Mark's wife and children continue to suffer from what Dale and those who are seduced by him to do?

The Bible is pretty clear about public sin and how to call it out as a warning to others to not to sin. When Christians, pastors ... the church doesn't do its job ... well ... don't be upset when the press gets involved and tells that full story that should have been told decades ago.

For this journey of spiritual abuse ...

let's start off with the latest and move toward the beginning in 2004.

Before we get started, though, let's ask some questions.


- Have you ever experienced where the abuser and those around the abuser want to know the motivation behind bringing something up?
 - One of the classic moves of the abuser is to deflect from their abuse.
 Like a great magician, use the slight of hand to distract or use any of the <u>9 D's</u>. A great response to the abuser on this is "What was your motivation for abusing the person in the first place?"
 - What abusers hope that everyone doesn't realize is that <u>sexual and spiritual abusers</u> almost never abuse one person. They continue to abuse people, especially children until they are stopped.
 - So ... the number one motivation is not only to stop Pastor Dale Willaims and those he leads from abusing others, but also to stop other pastors, deacons, and others in church authority from abusing people.
- Do you find it interesting that so much of the abuse happens from white males over 50 years old?
 - Why? Great question. It seems that just like sexual abusers who are the CWM50+ "Christian White Male over 50 years old' those who spiritually abuse are the same as the sexual abuser. They are really scared little men who fear being discovered for who they are.
- Do you find it interesting how the pastor / CWM50+ often do "hit and runs" where they won't respond, won't be in conversation, but will seek to get the law and police to protect them?
 - In this "case study," you'll find it interesting that Dale Williams uses other men to do his dirty work, just like he did 20 years ago. He got

his associate pastor to press things hard, a police Chief of Winfield, Illinois, and his deacons to do their dirty work.

- Why do pastors / CWM50+ try to huddle together and all go silent? Why do they fear answering questions?
 - Are they all involved in some type of abuse? Are some involved in sexual abuse while others are involved in spiritual abuse of authority, emotional abuse, relational abuse ... etc?

What does the church / Christian community do when a pastor is angry, bitter and vindictive over 17 years after he spiritually / emotionally crucifies one of his members? The answer? NOTHING!!!

This is a very interesting story. In this letter, Pastor Dale Williams was able to avoid having his fingerprints on anything. And the three deacons have never talked with Mark Boersma, whom they threaten with arrest and prosecution?



Previous associate Pastor Ken Boersma called Dale about this, and Dale gave him a very convincing story about a threatening email to Chief Riner. Still, when asked to produce that email, there was a story change, and Ken Boersma gladly accepted the new story.

Mark isn't angry at Dale or the three goofball deacons, Neal Charleson, Ray Nieto or John Hagerson. Did they think about their actions and the harm it could bring to the wife, children and grandchildren of Mark?

Think about it. What if ... all three of those guys had a certified letter sent to their homes or places of employment threatening legal action for what they did. Neal is a **CPA**, and works and is a **Vice President, Controller at Aria Care Partners as a remote worker**. If Neal is this reckless as a leader in a church, the chairman of the deacon board, well ... What does that say about the risk he may be to a company? Did Dale Williams, as a pastor, consider the career / financial risks that he put his deacons in when he asked them to do what they did?

What would Neal do if a reporter or the press were to approach him at work or at his home, in front of his wife, children, family and serve him a certified letter being notified that he was part of a lawsuit? After Jonathan Boersma's death on June 17th, 2020, Pastor Dale Williams admitted to talking with other pastors about the situation with Mark without Mark present or even knowing there was a conversation behind his back. 




Dale is an interesting character. Before the meeting with the church Dale approached Mark and said "If you withdraw your charges, we'll withdraw ours?"

It's sad but very clear that Dale didn't have the conviction that Mark had sin, that Mark had that Dale and Ken had sinned.

It's always fascinating when those who are guilty work to get out in front of things and bring charges against those they have sinned against and then accuse them of the very sins / crimes they have committed.

Looking closer at the letter sent to the church, you'll notice that Ralph Boersma didn't sign it. He refused to sign it because he said he didn't agree with the action being taken, yet... they included his name on there anyway.





It's interesting, isn't it, that they use legal terms like "contempt" by not making one of two choices that this man-made committee made up. Mark Boersma "invoked" his right in Matthew 18, as Paul did as a Greek citizen, to be heard by the entire church body.



What's interesting is that Dale Williams confessed to Mark Boersma 17 years after the event, and he talked to a pastor of a church that the Boersmas attended after Mark was kicked out of Emmanuel.

What triggered the question for Dale in the first place? It was the suicide death of Jonathan Boersma on June 17th, 2020. The pastor Dale talked to was the last pastor of the church that Jonathan regularly attended. So, based on Dale's confession, he did something that greatly impacted Jonathan as a teenage boy.

You might think that Dale would apologize, but he did not. He said that what he did was regularly done; yes, pastors would call it gossip if it was done against them, but what did Dale call it? Pastoral consideration.

Crazy right!?!? You would think that Ken Boersma, Jonathan's uncle and youth pastor for so many years, would be ... what the _____ and step in seeking to get to the bottom of it, but no, sir.

The story gets far better or worse, depending on how you look at it.

A year before Jonathan's death, Mark and Rosanna found out that Rosanna's father had sexually abused her for over seven years, from the age of 7 to 19 years old. When her parents were confronted, they brought in their pastor, who was part of the same denomination, the GARBC, as Dale Williams and Dale talked with him. That pastor referenced Dale and his conversation, which destroyed the relationship with Rosanna and her parents.

Yes, Dale also called that pastoral consideration as well.

Interestingly, a ghost organization heard about this and highlighted it on their website.

Oh ... it still gets better.

Two years after Joanthan's suicide, Mark Boersma was in town and decided to visit the church to heal from the death of his father and the death of his son to remember the many good times and what Dale Williams did. He had the police call, and Mark was removed from the property he had devoted his whole adult life to, which supported Dale Williams and his family financially for Dale's entire adult

life. Dale then had the deacons send Mark a certified letter threatening that if Mark ever set foot on the property again, he would be arrested and prosecuted.

One would think that Ken Boersma would set up and do something as he was the associate pastor at the time ... but ... no, sir. He talked to Dale, and Dale explained that Dale and the deacons did this because of a threatening email that was sent to Doug Riner.


Ken, finally messing around for weeks, pressed Dale to produce the email, but Dale said there was no email. Ken bought into this hook, line, and sinker.

You can't make this stuff up, and Christians don't like messy things, so they will do crazy stuff like "It's been 20 years, just let it go." ... Yet ... Dale hasn't let it go and calls the police in and uses the force of the law and will Ken, the deacons, the GARBC, or any other of Dale's friends call him on it. Nope! Do any of them care about the pain that was caused due to Jonathan's death and Dale's involvement so many years early? Nope.

Will anyone confront Dale about his involvement with someone who protected a sexual abuser of a young 12-year-old girl? Nope.

Ken is interesting. Even though he said he loved the book, it didn't seem to change his mind or actions.

Page 27 ... "Neuroscientists have shown that these biases in thinking are built into the way the brain processes information ... Drew Westen and his colleagues found that the reasoning areas of the brain virtually shut down when participants were confronted with dissonant information ... "



What does this mean? It means that if Dale, Ken, or any of the church leaders and/or their families were to read this document, it would likely not change anything.

Page 28 ... "Indeed, even reading information that goes against your point of view can make you all the more convinced you are right."

This explains a lot!

It's almost like if someone were to read this and their brains wanted to believe that this was not Dale and Ken but Mark or anyone else, they would somehow find all the evidence they could and ignore the rest. It's like their poor brains would be selective in what they saw, and anything that didn't match, they would somehow twist in their own minds ... and hear something that wasn't said and/or see things that weren't even there and not see the things that are there.

What's the answer?

People like Dale Williams, Ken Boersma, and the deacons seem locked into believing what they want to think, and nothing else matters. But there is something that does matter. What matters to these types of people is what others around them think of them.

They care what their wife thinks of them. They care about what their children and grandchildren think of them. They care about what their friends and the community think of them, and their hope and prayer is that this doesn't get out to those people. The press in small towns, like Warrenville, IL or Morris, IL, also don't like to look into this and report on this as their advertisers ... readers don't want to think this type of thing can happen in their town ... or maybe that's not true.

When Dale & Ken's denomination was asked about the sexual abuse, they said they could not do anything about it unless the pastor (yes, the one who is protecting the sexual abuser of a 12-year-old girl and likely other young girls as well.)

No one in the press or the community seems to take on this stuff until one woman has the courage to step up and drive this forward, and by then, the pastor / the men in the church have often abused so many girls you lose count.

It's interesting, isn't it, that the religious leaders of Jesus' day crucified him soon after he had confronted them about how they weren't being honest about money.

Dale's financial compensation his entire life has been based on the church that Ralph Beorsma and his family built.

Chief Riner, over the last 20 years, has talked to Mark Boersma many times and has always invited Mark to attend the church and said he was always welcome ... until Pastor Dale decided that he would get the police / legal involved and make sure that Mark would never set foot on the property that he had devoted his whole adult life to and that his dad had built from nothing.

Dear Discipline Committee,

This letter and document has been bathed in prayer and waiting on the Lord for over two years. My prayer is that God would be glorified by this and that Holy Spirit would cause repentance and restoration would occur.

I know this is a very long document and there are some of the pieces are separate while others are more tied together. I apologize if things are not clear at times, if there are events which are repeated more than needed, or if there are pieces in this document which should not have been.

Prior to this whole ordeal of presenting to the Deacons, I believed the greatest sin was misleading and deceiving the church on the financial situation of the church and where the church was putting its money. This is the major reason we have decided to modify

our attendance a great deal and there is a great probability we will end up leaving the church.

Over the last two days, it has become apparent to me that there is even a greater sin for which I believe could very well could prevent both men from serving in ministry for some time as they will not be blameless.



There's a lot here; obviously, someone invested much time and consideration in this.

When we asked Mark why he didn't get the document out to the entire church, he felt that he didn't want to split the church or harm the members.

But in light of the latest development from Pastor Dale Williams and Ken Boersma's unwillingness or inability to have any influence on the church he grew up in and then played the role of pastor for 10 years and was the most aggressive in getting Mark kicked out of the




church, one would think that Ken could do something, but seems like he has no influence. It's interesting how aggressive Ken can get when he thinks he is harmed, but when he and another pastor harm others, well, "What can he do?"

When this document turned up, we asked Mark to re-read it after 20 years and share his thoughts.

Mark smiled as he thought about how he was applying Matthew 18 and bringing charges against Pastor Dale Williams and Ken Boersma.

He asked some great questions ... and you know they were never answered.

What's also interesting is that a week or so before the church discipline meeting, Dale told Mark that if he dropped the charges against them, they would drop charges against Mark.



Isn't it interesting that Mark brought charges against Dale and Ken, and then they kicked him out of the church?

Isn't that how Mark starts? Later in the document, it is established that Dale and Ken had no sin against Mark other than that Ken felt that Mark was prideful.

Ken had no specific situations; he just had a feeling. You can feel the guy's heart if you look at the words when you read this.

- (A) This is not a guy going after these guys' heads; it's someone who seems humble and thankful for the influence both of these guys had on his life. The question may be ... "What in the world were Dale and Ken thinking when they read this?"
- (B) It is Interesting how many years Mark submitted to Dale and Ken, and they still used that as one of the main reasons they said he was kicked out.
- (C) Of the three men on the disciplinary committee, all three had affairs while the discipline was going on or soon after. Two men, Denny Rogers and Ron Delicath, divorced their wives. Pete Johnson was able to reconcile with his wife.

March 1, 2003 (Date when letter started to be developed after much prayer.)

Dear Emmanuel Leaders.

Greetings from the Lord and may God continue to bless Emmanuel as He has in the past and may God be glorified in all things. The leadership within the church has been a great concern for me for a number of years. I have express this a number of times to both pastoes and have asked frequently to talk with those in leadership and have not be permitted to do so as a group.

I started to praying August 23, 2000 about God's will to change the constitution. I added to that prayer request praying for strong leadership in the charch April 4, 2001, wisdom in talking with the deacons April 14, 2001, Pastor Williams and officers May 5, 2001, and accusation of sin against Pastor Ken May 5, 2001. I have prayed through God's strength everyday for these situations since the day I added them to my prayer list. I have invested a great deal of time in studying the Word in these areas, and have received Godly counsel and feedback from other Godly mes. My goal is that God will be glorified and that I will have approaching this situation in a godly manner, with love, humbleness, and tenderness.

When I look back the many years of Pastor Williams leadership within the church and his patience, prayer, and ministry in my life I don't know if there has been anyone outside of my parents and my wife who has made such a positive and substantial impact on my life personally. Pastor Ken is not only my brother-in-Cheist, but my brother by blood. I love both of these men and their families immensely and care for their ministry, which is why I am writing this letter and bringing these charges.

I have expressed to them a number of times my concerns about their ministry and the consequences I believe could happen if they were not to change. A number of times I have requested to talk to the elected leaders of the church about these and other leadership issues and each and every time it has been met with resistance. Out of respect for those men and their positions each and every time I have decided not to push the issue

- (B) through, but to submit to their leaderships.
- I believe there is troubling pattern within their ministry which is not only holding back their effectiveness an holding back God's blessing for the church, but also placing the flock in spiritual danger as well. I believe that those in leadership are also picking up some of these weaknesses, which also place the congregation as a whole in danger and especially their immediate families.
- (D) churches altogether. I don't not believe that answer to these challenges is for one or both pastors to leave the church. I believe if they were to leave the church and go onto other ministries, over a period of years, the same situation would occur again.

There are very few people who know me as well as Pastor Williams and know where I was over five years ago spiritually and how much I have grown in the Lord. Like most things in life, this letter would have been easier not written. By bringing these charges I put the life-long relationships that were developed by myself, my wife, and my children at risk. If I did not have so much love and respect for the God's work and the lives

In studying scripture, I believe that the passage of Matthew 18:15 applies to seeing a brother in sin and the I Timothy 5:19 applies to those in spiritual leadership. I have asked for spiritual direction in the past and asked for leadership as it relates to the seaming conflict between the verses and there hasn't been much response. Another wise counselor and one of my spiritual accountability partners shared something which provided further insight into the verses and helped me to understand that the Timothy 5:19 verses seems to apply to those in spiritual leadership.

I have talked to both Pastor Williams and Pastor Ken about a number of the issues which are brought up in this accusation as this has been what I understood to be the Biblical direction and what I was directed to do from those in spiritual leadership. I now believe that God has given me a better understanding of scripture and the proper way to address what I would consider sin in the lives of those in spiritual leadership.

When you read this, you get the feeling that Mark sensed something was very wrong with both Dale and Ken's leadership and that it was also affecting the other men in leadership.

- **(D)** Here, Mark makes it very clear that he is not pushing for either man to be disciplined out of the church, just to get their act together.
- **(E)** Mark is clearly aware of the risks he is taking to do this and clearly lays out his concerns and heart. Why in the world ... Were Dale and Ken unable to see

Mark's heart through the written words? Was it that their hearts were so hardened that they could not read or see Mark's heart at all?
