Intro To Photoshop -Liquify Tool

Outline for Video

Command-E to send photo to PS	1	
Click on the person layer	1	
Play with all of the settings to see what this does		
Close the picture to send it back to Lightroom	1	

Find a photo with a close up a person's face in LR:

1. Command-E to send photo to PS

- a. The photo will open in PS
- b. Change background to "Original"
- c. Duplicate the Original layer (cmd-J)
- d. Relabel it "Face liquify"
- e. Hide Original layer

2. Click on the person layer

a. Choose Filter>Liquify

3. Play with all of the settings for Face aware liquify

- a. Click OK when you are done
- b. Compare the two layers by turn on and off the visibility of the layers

4. Duplicate the original layer

- a. Click on the original layer
- b. Duplicate the Original layer by typing cmd-J
- c. Relabel the new layer as "Manual liquify"
- d. Drag the Manual Liquify Layer up above the Face Liquify layer

5. Choose Filter>Liquify

- a. Open brush tool options
- 6. If it's not already selected, select the Forward Warp tool (W).
 - i. You can use this to push groups of pixels around
 - ii. You can adjust the brush using the brush settings
 - iii. Or you can adjust the brush size with the left and right square brackets

7. Select The reconstruction tool (R)

- a. Paint on the area that you changed and it will go back to the way it was.
- 8. Play with each tool on the left to see what it does.
- 9. Close the picture to send it back to Lightroom
