Elmer F. Doemel, 80, of Oshkosh, died Friday March 13, 1998 at the Oshkosh Medical and Rehabilitation. He was born in Oshkosh on September 28, 1917 the son of Frederick and Mathilda Reihl Doemel. On May 1, 1940 he married Mildred R. Nelson in Oshkosh. She preceded him in death on November 26, 1997.

Mr. Doemel had been the owner of the H. Derksen & Sons Co. where he had worked for over fifty years. He was a member of the St. Paul United Church of Christ and had served his country in the U.S. Army during WWII. He had belonged to numerous organizations including the Elks BPOE #292, the United Commercial Travelers, the American Legion Cook-Fuller Post 70, and the Otter Street Fishing Club.
