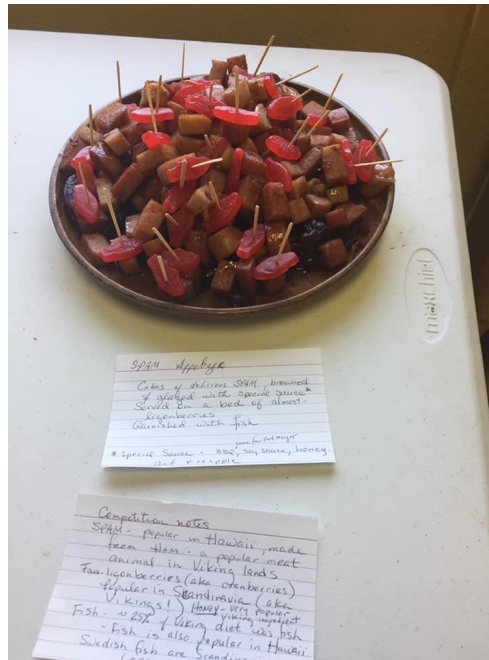
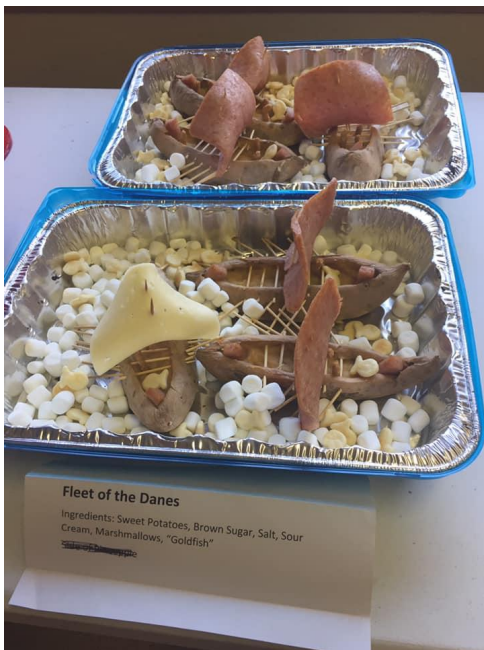

[Albertus Magnus on Warhorses](#)

“We can sometimes find small bits of interesting reports about medieval warfare from unusual sources. This can be seen in a thirteenth century book about animals.

De animalibus (On Animals) is one of several surviving works by Albertus Magnus (d.1280), who is considered one of the leading scholars of the Middle Ages. A Dominican friar and bishop from Germany, Magnus wrote on a wider variety of topics, from music to philosophy to astronomy. The natural world was one of his main interests, and *De animalibus* is a vast collection of information about creatures large and small.

In a long section devoted to horses, Magnus explains there are four types of creature: warhorses, palfreys, racehorses and workhorses. He then starts with a description of warhorses, which offers some insights into how they behaved during battle:

War-horses are not castrated because they are rendered timid by castration. It is a trait of these horses to delight in musical sounds, to be excited by the sounds of arms, and to gather together with other chargers. They also leap and burst into battle lines by biting and striking with their hooves. They sometimes care so much about their masters and grooms that, if they are killed, they grow and pine away, event to the point of death. In sadness they sometimes cry and from this there are those who forecast concerning a future victory or defeat.

The last lines about weeping horses seem to be following a tradition that goes back to ancient Greece. Magnus goes on to discuss the other types of horses and then moves on how they should be taken care of and various diseases that can harm them.

His work has been translated (in two hefty volumes) as *On Animals: A Medieval Summa Zoologica*, by Kenneth F. Kitchell Jr. and Irvn Michael Resnick, and published by The John Hopkins University Press in 1999.

Newcomer's Hints

Tech Tuesday with Viscountess Sylvie

“Hey Sylvie, Google Suite is cool and all, but what other interesting tech resources are available to folks in the West Kingdom?”

By far my favorite non-Google Tech resource is the West Kingdom History site:

<http://history.westkingdom.org/>

Hirsch (Ken Mayer) has put a lot of time and effort into the History site and has made it super useful. Most of us (myself included) only scratch the surface.

When you receive an official award, in addition to being published in "The Page" the award will show up on your entry on the Who's Who pages of the History site. It is in your best interest to check your entry and make sure everything is listed and is correct.

The site was recently updated to make finding a person even easier through the new search tools. Try it out!

It's also possible to add photos and other content to your entry

First, get a login:

Goto <http://history.westkingdom.org/help/help.php>

Click on "Login" and follow the instructions.

You can add event photos, A&S photos, and links to more documentation. Your Who's-Who page is used by the peerage councils. It's in your best interest to make sure it says something interesting about you and puts your best foot forward. “

“Hey Sylvie, now that I'm able to log into the History site, what cool things can I do? (You did get a login, right? How to get a History site login:

Head over to the history site and log in <http://history.westkingdom.org/>.

Now search the site and find your entry <http://history.westkingdom.org/Who/namesearch.php>.

Start with reviewing your information. Is your location correct? Is your preferred title correct (did you know that "Magnifica" or "Magnifico" is one of the acceptable honorifics for a peer?

<https://www.facebook.com/scaResearchBlog/posts/2898896666847642>)? Did you link to you SCA resume in your SHORT Biography?

Next click on the tabs at the top next to "Basic Profile Information" and double check the information in the other tabs.

Finally (the good stuff) click on the "Arts/Sciences" tab and click on the button labeled "My A&S Projects" this will take you a section where you can add images and links to A&S projects you've done. These links will end up on your entry on the history site and can work as an artist's portfolio.

Service Secrets

From Mistress Leah:

"The Lists & You: How to Make Tourneys Run Smoothly From the Fighter Perspective (How we, together, can make your tourney better)

- Put the name that you want used in invocation neatly on the sign-up sheet, the heralds will have exactly what you signed up with to announce.
- Laminate or use a plastic sleeve for both membership and fighter cards, have photos of your and your consort's memberships on phone as a back-up. A print-out or email of recent renewals is acceptable. While it can happen, do not expect the lists to have a current membership list for reference.
- Make sure both your authorization and membership are current before coming to the table - For the heralds to pronounce your name correctly, include your name on the official membership renewal so that it is typed on your membership card and will be spelled that way on your lists card. It also helps to get phonetic hints that work from the heralds & use them.
- If you are a squire/cadet, fill in your Knight/MoD's name in the space on the form so that lists does not accidentally put both of you on the same field if you are crossed over.
- For fighters that sign up the night before the tourney, it is important to remember to pick up the card or send someone to get it for you from the lists table the next morning rather than expecting the lists to hunt you down.
- Be sure to get your card signed by the inspecting marshal once you are inspected, being tracked down to handle this after invocation is embarrassing and has happened.
- Invocation uses the highest title, rather than preferred fighting title, so make certain to mark the sheet appropriately and don't be disturbed by invocation not matching any fighter card preference.
- If you have a title preference (Jarl vs Count, Sir vs Viscount, etc.) be sure to make that clear to the lists personnel, don't assume that they will ask or know. Ajax is someone who is an excellent example of doing this well, he makes sure that lists knows to use the title Satrap.
- Don't challenge onto your knight/squire sibling/regular fighter practice buddy/consort's field if you do not want to fight them in early rounds. Lists separates known relationships of the challengees, but cannot prevent these from happening when challengers create these conflicts.
- Depending on the number of people in the lists, fields may be run independently or as

partnered pairs. Be ready to hear your call from the fields that are adjacent and to the same side of the Eric from the perspective of the royalty (or whoever...)

How the Lists Work (What we do)

- Each fighter is assigned a number, the even numbers are for the challengers (Consort's side) and odds are for the challengees (Sovereign's side, including cross-overs).
- If there is more than one field, then the Sovereign side fighters are assigned to different fields based on OP followed by balancing of field strength. Once the fields are assigned, then the order within each field is arranged similarly to distribute the strongest fighters most evenly throughout that field's order. That is when the odd numbers can usually start to be assigned to the Sovereign side fighters. (An exception is if there will need to be a first round bye.)
- The challengers are assigned to the field sheets and given their card numbers based on their challenges after Invocation has happened and once the pairs of cards come back to the table - The number/size of fields are determined by the royalty based on the number of fighters and on the availability of staffing by heralds/marshals/list pages and lists staff, as is the timing for collapsing fields down (and opening a field for roses).
- The first round is built of the challenge pairs (1 fights 2, 3 fights 4, etc), the second round pairs the odd number fighters together and the even number (challenger) fighters together (1 fights 3, 2 fights 4, etc).
- In each round, pairs are made starting from the top of the order so that fighters are always meeting the first person down the list that they have not yet fought, but with the hitch that pairings near the bottom of the list may need to be mixed up to make this possible. In late rounds, it may not be possible to avoid repeat fights/byes.
- If a bye is needed, it is assigned to the fighter closest to the bottom of the list that has not yet had one, whether the byes are being fought or not.
- If byes are fought, then a fighter's position in the general order will not change. If byes are not being fought, then the fighter closest to the _bottom_ of the list that has not yet had a bye will be rolled up to the top of the order for the next round (and will be the first fight then) and they will stay in that portion of the order from that point on. From the Lists Perspective (How you can make our job easier)
- Print your name as neatly as possible on sign-up sheet so that it is correct for both invocation and your fighter card.
- If you have a royal title earned by your hand, be sure to mark it on the sign-up sheet. It is not being modest to leave it off, it is making more work for the lists staff to look it up and delays the fighting. These are factored into the field assignment, don't assume the lists staff knows...
- Sign up early, then go get armored up. The number/assignment of crosses between fields depends on the ratio of chivalry to unbelts. As this requires the royalty's time and attention, leaving your sign up to the last moment delays the lists' ability to provide the heralds with names and field assignments for invocation and slows the start of the fighting.
- Bring the fighter cards from Invocation to the lists table immediately after the challenges so that the pairs can be recorded and the cards put into order for starting the lists promptly.
- The lists staff works from numbers, not names, so knowing who is the next fight/who is alive (or clean) is not a quick answer and asking this slows down the tournament for everyone.

- Side conversations and questions while the lists staff is working can be a real problem- this is an exacting job that requires concentration for tracking a lot of data and errors can be dramatic.
- It is important to keep a clear line of view/access to the table in order for the staff to keep track of the fights and so that the lists pages can get in and out easily.
- Lists pages are always essential, and they need replacements as tourneys go on. Volunteers are always appreciated."
