




We even assisted to a church service and we were very grateful, seeing the priest and how many people came to church, everything was gorgeous. And people here are very nice and stylish.














After this last visit, we went to the airport and flew back home. I didn't want it to end so quickly, but I loved every part of this experience and I will gladly do it again if I could.
