The Centering Equity in Passive House Challenge

We ask members of the Passive House community to challenge themselves, their companies and organizations, to take on self-identified commitments which build up the next generation of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) professionals in the design, engineering, construction, and management of the Passive House movement across North America.

The Centering Equity in Passive House Challenge asks the Passive House architecture and building community to self-identify and adopt an action plan, guided by the following questions:

Ideas & Options for Action Plans

Dedicating Funds:

- Develop funds for scholarships awarded to young, BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) professionals to attend Passive House training and earn Passive House professional certification
- Carry out anti-oppression training for staff of your organization
- Establish mentorship relationships with young, BIPOC professionals
- Dedicating a percentage of revenue and/or pro-bono hours to supporting Passive House projects in low-income and BIPOC communities on an annual basis

• Implement Hiring Practices:

- Creating paid internship/fellowship programs opportunities for young, BIPOC professionals
- Committing to hiring goals and intentional recruitment strategies to increase
 BIPOC representation and leadership within your organization
- Hiring a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Officer
- Establishing ways to have an equity-first approach to bringing in BIPOC contractors and partners

Internal Transformation:

- Undertaking internal, collective analysis to identify and transform systemic barriers and cultural characteristics that reinforce exclusionary outcomes
- Acknowledging that building is not a neutral act, and that it is our job as designers and developers of Passive House projects to measure the social impacts of our work in the communities we work
- Identifying and connecting with existing BIPOC-led organizations in the communities we work to provide popular education, youth programs, and support for people to implement and experience Passive House projects in action
- Advocating for protective and proactive policies that center racial and economic justice in all legislation and standards guiding development, housing, and planning processes.
