

# Elementary i-Ready FAQ

**Q:** The BOY Window for the Diagnostic does not open until September 22nd. Can I take it earlier?

**A:** To stay consistent with the district assessment calendar, the diagnostic window cannot change. However, if you would like to use the program between now and 9/22, you can [manually assign lessons](#) to students. As a reminder, the BOY iReady Diagnostic is only required for Tier 2 and Tier 3 students.

**Q:** Can I use the program between August 12th and September 22nd while I wait for the Diagnostic window to open?

**A:** Yes! Teachers can manually assign lessons during this time frame.

**Q:** How long does the iReady Diagnostic take?

**A:** The length of the iReady Diagnostic will vary by grade level. [Click here for a detailed estimate by grade level](#). We recommend giving the diagnostic in 20-30 minute chunks over several days to avoid impacting tier 1 instruction.

**Q:** Can I give the iReady Diagnostic in chunks?

**A:** Yes! We recommend you give the diagnostic in 20-30 minute chunks over several days to avoid impacting tier 1 instruction. Embedding the assessment into iTime would be a great way to ensure you do not lose tier 1 instruction time.

**Q:** If a student takes the BOY Diagnostic in Spanish, can I switch their MOY Diagnostic to English?

**A:** Please refer to the iReady language of assessment guidance document for specifics for each grade level. [iReady Guidance 2025-2026](#)

**Q:** If I have some students take the Spanish Diagnostic and some students take the English Diagnostic, will I receive the same reports?

**A:** For math, yes! Reports are available in both languages. For RLA, reports will differ based on the language assessed in.

**Q:** If I have students take the Spanish Diagnostic will their pathway be in Spanish as well?

**A:** For math, yes! Student's individualized pathways will be automatically set to English, regardless of what language the Diagnostic was taken in. However, teachers can change the language of a student's pathway to Spanish. For RLA, the student's pathway will be in English and teachers can assign lessons in Spanish.

**Q:** If my campus is not a dual language campus, can a student still take the diagnostic in

Spanish?

**A:** Our recommendation is for students to take the diagnostic in the same language as instruction.

**Q:** How will students who get oral admin (IEP accommodations) be able to receive their support through i-Ready?

**Q:** Can students take the diagnostic test again if they are not completing it or rushing through it?

**A:** Yes, students can take the diagnostic again.

**Q:** Does i-Ready sync with Focus to update students?

**A:** Yes. It will sync overnight for newly enrolled students.

**Q:** What if students are performing above grade level, will i-Ready allow for them to make growth?

**A:** All students receive differentiated growth targets. Students who test on or above grade level, will receive a lower growth target than those who test below grade level, making their growth targets attainable and just right for them.
