The goal of these programs is to give prospective students a comprehensive view of the academic, social, and cultural environment of that college or university.

Free Emory Leads Scholarships: LEADs is designed to support the recruitment of talented, high-achieving high school seniors who are either first-generation college students and/or from a rural or lower socioeconomic background, and/or students who do not have the means to visit campus.

Free! Voices of Tufts: In fall 2025, we will offer both an on-campus Voices of Tufts program and a virtual Voices of Tufts program. Any rising senior - class of 2026 - who attends high school in the US is eligible for nomination. While Voices has traditionally attracted participants with strong academic records from a variety of backgrounds – including but not limited to students of color, first generation college-bound students, LGBTQIA+ students, students from low-income backgrounds, students with disabilities, and students from rural communities – any student interested in learning more about the Tufts community is welcome to apply. Most importantly, we seek to invite high-achieving students who are kind, collaborative, civically-engaged, and interested in creating a more inclusive world.

Programs and Mentorships

<u>Matriculate</u> is a FREE virtual college advising program that connects eligible students with a near-peer mentor who works one-on-one with students throughout the college and financial aid processes. Matriculate connects high-achieving, low-income juniors and seniors to highly-trained undergraduate advisors—completely virtually—empowering students to attend colleges where they will thrive. We work with <u>Bloomberg Philanthropies</u> college access and success initiative, <u>CollegePoint</u>, to reach first-generation college students across the country. <u>College Essay Guy Matchlighter Program:</u> The Matchlighters Scholars Program pairs highly motivated students from low-income households with experienced college counselors. It's totally free and applying couldn't be easier. Students must be US residents (undocumented students welcome), you are trying to get into college, you have a 3.0 GPA, your family income qualifies you for enrollment in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families, you are motivated and ready to work.

Ongoing Internships

Army Educational Outreach Program: In collaboration with universities and U.S. Army Research Laboratories and Centers, the AEOP is proud to offer summer internships for high school students throughout the country. <u>FAO</u> about the application and experience. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Federal Government Internship Finder: The federal government offers many exciting job opportunities, but they can be difficult to find, track and navigate. The GoGovernment Federal Internship Finder, created by the Partnership for Public Service, will simplify your search for federal opportunities. Students can filter for opportunities for high school students.

Marine Trades Association of Maryland: MTAM is a non-profit dedicated to promoting the recreational marine industry and the preservation of waterways our business members rely on. MTAM was founded in 1972 and membership comprises nearly 400 marine related businesses. Interns will interview with MTAM partners for a 6 week program to learn one of the following specialties of the boating industry: engine mechanic, composite repair, systems technician, electronics installment or management and marketing. Students must be in grade 12 and the opportunity is open for summer or during the school year. Rolling applications are accepted.

<u>Maryland State Police Internship Opportunities:</u> Maryland State Police Internship Program is a non-paid mentorship initiative that provides an introductory opportunity to students interested in learning about the administrative and operational functions of our agency. It helps give students direction on what career path they may want to pursue both in the civilian and sworn field. Students are accepted on a rolling basis, must be 16 years of age, and must commit to working for 10 hours a week for 8 weeks.

Maryland State Archives: Interns will engage in a variety of activities related to processing, managing, and interpreting archival collections. Individual intern assignments will vary, but duties may include reference, conservation, research, art history/handling, writing, web design, electronic imaging, computer programming and testing, record transcription, inventorying, cataloging and accessioning. The intern program includes a heavy focus on the application of computer technology to both the historical method and archival practice. Open to grades 9, 10, 11, 12. Rolling applications and students can work during the summer or school year. No stipend is provided.

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Student Opportunities Database: Welcome to NOAA's student opportunities database! NOAA has opportunities for students of any level — from kindergarten through high school, undergraduate and graduate, and even recent graduates. Opportunities include one-day events, summer internships at NOAA, multi-year fellowships, and more. Deadlines and eligibility requirements vary.

Rice University Pre-Courses: Our goal in creating Rice University's Pre-college Program is to provide an experience for students ages 13+ that embodies these values. Our program is designed for high school students who wish to dive deeper into subjects that piques their interest, such as genome engineering, physiology, aerospace, law, and more. Each course features dynamic video lessons by renowned Rice faculty and access to mentors. Courses are available year-round, and the online format enables students to study anywhere, anytime, at their own pace. Upon successfully completing a course's capstone project, participants will earn a Certificate of Completion from Rice University.
