BILL TO ESTABLISH ON CALL AS AN ASSU SERVICE ORGANIZATION

STATUS: 29 November 2023, **Passed 10-0-0** (UGS)

WHEREAS Article VIII, Section 1 of the Joint By-Laws authorizes the formation of student-run agencies to provide services to the campus community;

WHEREAS On Call is a student-run, late-night cafe collective which serves low-cost snacks and drinks in a space that hosts music, games, art, and conversation;

WHEREAS On Call satisfies a need for community-building opportunities and affordable, late-night meals on campus;

WHEREAS On Call demonstrated demand with a successful two-night pop-up in the Haas Center for Public Service, which served more than 1,000 students in total;¹

WHEREAS On Call is operated by a six-person executive team, plus a 30-member kitchen and barista staff;

WHEREAS Article VIII, Section 1.E.1 of the Joint By-Laws specifies that service organizations “shall be created by a 2/3 vote of the relevant Association legislative [body] to fulfill a specific charge”;

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE SENATE:

THAT On Call be established as a service organization of the ASSU, with all the privileges which that designation entails;

THAT On Call is charged with the provision of low-cost snacks and drinks to students at the times and places deemed appropriate by their executive team;

THAT On Call be exempt from the meeting requirements of Article VIII, Section 1.F;

THAT the organizational status of On Call be re-evaluated on a quarterly basis.
