Keynote Speaker KaaVonia Hinton, PhD

*Associate Professor in Teaching and Learning at
Old Dominion University*

Dr. Hinton is an associate professor in Teaching and Learning at Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Virginia. She is the author of several books including Sharon M. Draper: *Embracing Literacy* (2009) and co-author (with Gail K. Dickinson) of *Integrating Multicultural Literature in Libraries and Classrooms in Secondary Schools* (Linworth, 2007) was a director of Tidewater Writing Project from 2005-2013. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in English Education and a Masters of Art degree in African American and English literature both from North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University in Greensboro, North Carolina. Her doctorate in English Education was earned in 2003 at The Ohio State University. Hinton's scholarship focuses on literacy materials created specifically for blacks: literature for adults, children and young adults, especially works labeled multicultural; critical biographies of black writers, and literary criticism. Her research interests are Young Adult Literature, writing to learn, and bio criticism. Her work has been published in *Social Education*, *Multicultural Review*, *Journal of Children's Literature* and *English Journal*. She has also contributed to encyclopedias such as the *Encyclopedia of African American Literature*, *Encyclopedia of Ethnic American Literature* and *Feminist Encyclopedia of African American Literature*. Her reviews of young adult and children's literature are found regularly in *Kliatt*, *VOYA*, and *ForeWord Magazine*.
