


Access Chrome Settings

- 1. At the bottom right, click on the time.
- 2. Click the Settings gear:


Turn on Select-to-Speak

- 3. Click the Accessibility category.
- 4. Click the option for "Text to Speech."





5. Toggle on "Select-to-speak."



Use Select-to-Speak

This <u>video</u> will explain the following options.

Option 1

- 1. Press and hold the Search key $^{\mathsf{Q}}$.
- 2. Drag the pointer over an area of text.

Option 2

- 1. Highlight the text to be read.
- 2. Press the Search key 4 + s.

Option 3

- 1. At the bottom right, near the time, select Select-to-Speak .
- 2. Drag the pointer over an area of text.



Q: Does this work on Google Docs?

A: Yes!

Q: Can it highlight the text as it speaks?

A: Yes. If you are using Select-to-speak, each word will be highlighted as it's spoken. You can turn off highlighting, change the color of the highlighted words, or shade the screen behind selected text.
