1st place went to Harmony Devoe (a student at Harwood Middle School). Harmony advocated for keeping Finding Junie Kim by Ellen Oh, on the library shelf because

Vermont needs more books that raise awareness about racism and that help Asian American students like herself feel represented.

2nd place was Emma Aither (a student at Harwood Middle School). Emma proposed that rather than banning Ghost Boys by Jewell Parker Rhodes, the town or library should host community conversations with guest speakers to increase awareness about racism and hate.

3rd place was James Michelle Shenk (a student at Crossett Brook Middle School). James wrote about the critical need to keep books like Melissa by Alex Gino accessible to all students to provide opportunity for transgender representation and discussion.

Board Reports:

Discussion:

Professional Development Committee: About a year ago the board started a professional development committee. This committee met once or twice, and came up with relevant topics for board members to learn more about. "Homework" was assigned with the assumption this would be completed prior to the second meeting of the month. Designated agenda time (20-30 minutes) would be given for the full board to discuss that topic. Is this something the board wants to start back up? If so, do the same people want to continue on this committee? The time commitment would probably be 1-2 meetings at most.

Bond Planning: After looking over the extensive needs of our schools it is apparent that we will need to move forward on a more sustainable way of supporting these upgrades. In addition to looking at what the priority needs are we will be looking at how to engage our communities, both town and schools. Our hope is that rich discussions will happen and both students and the community will be able to come together to support their district and longevity of the buildings.
