In the Opening Paragraph:

Title and author
The hook/attention getter
Claim/main idea
Road map (main points)

<u>In the body paragraphs</u>:

Topic sentence for body paragraph Quotes from the text Context Citations Link/conclusion

In the conclusion:

Restatement of the claim Restatement of road map (main points) Leave reader thinking about big ideas

- Add grammar/spelling corrections as comments (Control + Alt + M).
- Does the author cite the page number? (pg. #). If not, make a comment.
- Does the author introduce the quotes? (The quote is not on its own.) If not, make a comment.
- Does the author provide context for the quotes? (Who says what and when?) If not, make a comment.
- Does the author use third person? (NO I, ME, MY, WE, US, YOU) If not, make a comment.
