3) At least one semester in an immersion study abroad program in Germany, Austria, or Switzerland (with one year **strongly** recommended). See Bulletin for additional options if financial or personal circumstances preclude a student from studying abroad.

*Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

**A senior paper to be completed during a seminar course (GERM 400+) in senior year.

***Due April 1 of senior year. Student to seek guidance from a Faculty Advisor on creating a portfolio as soon as they declare their major.
