

Here are the driving instructions to Camp Gilboa:

The official address is 38200 Bluff Lake Rd., Big Bear Lake, CA 92315, but please **DO NOT just input it into Google Maps or another GPS system as they will likely try to take you from the other side of the mountain and you will get stuck!**

Best is to use GPS to arrive to “Oak Knoll Lodge” 949 Tulip Ln, Big Bear Lake, CA 92315. Make sure it is taking you via the 330 and the 18, NOT the 38. If it is taking you via the 38, please call us for help at (562) 234-9957.

Once you reach Oak Knoll Lodge, follow the directions below (Note: There will also be signs on the road pointing you in the right direction):

1. Turn **onto Mill Creek Road** at Oak Knoll Lodge (from this point on, you'll have 3.7 miles until step 7).
 - a. There is a “Road Closed” sign at the entrance to this road because it is currently closed to the public, but you can use it because you're coming to Camp Gilboa and we have a permit.
2. Mill Creek becomes a forest service road (2N10). The road from here is quite rough - **DRIVE SLOWLY AND CAREFULLY!**
3. You will quickly encounter a split in the road towards Camp Cedar Lake - continue **LEFT** up the 2N10, do not turn right towards Camp Cedar Lake.
 - a. ~~The white forest service gate should be closed. The code is 2621. Please close the gate again behind you!~~
 - i. ~~Make sure to push the lock in before pulling it out or it will not unlock~~
 - ii. ~~It may be a chain - if so, please make sure to lock the locks back *to each other* so either one is able to open the chain.~~
 - iii. ~~It may be a metal stick - if you look at the top and see a key lock instead of a combo lock, check underneath for the bottom lock. Once you get the combo lock off, you may need to jiggle the gate back and forth to pull the stick out.~~
4. Once it becomes a dirt road, continue on it **for almost 3 miles (stay on Skyline 2N10 – don't take 2N10 B or C or 2N17)**. The road is long and windy (and beautiful), so don't think that you're lost... Track the mileage and you'll be able to see if you've gone too far.
 - a. Along the way, you will pass a fork in the road to Camp Osito, stay to the **RIGHT** and do not turn left towards Camp Osito.
 - b. You may encounter some orange and white barriers, if so you can move them to the side to pass by and then please replace them behind you.
5. After a little less than 3 miles on 2N10 you'll come to a T in the road – Turn **LEFT**. Continue for half a mile.
6. After half a mile there's a small brown forest service sign to Camp Gilboa– turn **RIGHT**. **This sign is easy to miss, so drive slowly once you've passed the forest service map.** You'll be arriving in less than 2 minutes to camp.

- a. The green gate should be open, but if it's not, the code is 6769. Please leave it open.
- b. If the road becomes 2N11, then you've missed the turn, and you need to go back.
