The innovation of the Big Bang School and School of Nature's programs lies in building an open cross-community through sociocultural learning tools, naturalistic principles while focusing on the reflective and critical thinking. The schools' curricula called Harmony are an educational paradigm based on nature, by nature and with nature that aims to contribute in a communal learning path. 'Harmony' curriculum empowers the educational commons using holistic and transdisciplinary approaches, providing the participation of the local actors, institutes, families, citizens, students and educators. We aim to present the participation of the School of Nature and the Big Bang School in the SMOOTH project by creating a community in the Forest. More specifically, it seems that we dispose tools as peer-to-peer government, linguistic and cultural empathy, tables of love, sustainability projects, active hearing, meditation, reflection team practices and self-reflection. Our tools create a continuum between family, children, educators, local community, institutions and the researchers. We will demonstrate how all of the above create emotional thresholds of a precious socio-cultural learning. For the research, we used different methods of data collection such as teachers' diaries, observations of the researchers and the academical responsible of the curricula, questionnaires, videos and photos, open discussions with the children and the families.
