

So you wanna be a Pogo intern, huh?

Well here is a guide to generally guide you on how to make a Pogo Doll look like... well.. A Pogo Doll


Let's Start With The Sketch!

Pogo dolls tend to have rounded, squishy, plushy shapes (for the most part) because... they are plushies.

Body Shape!

Generally round and squishy bean shapes or floppy flour-sack type shapes. (Depends on the character.)

Limbs!

Limbs tend to be fairly simple for the most part (Though like most rules, there are always exceptions)

The most common types of limbs tend to be very simple and/or nubby in design. Some have more details, but you're more likely to see things like:

Heads!

Generally round and simplistic, basically think "Could I see a plushie in real life looking like this?" And if the answer is yes then it probably works.

Ears and other small additional appendages!

These generally follow the same "If it's on a real life plushie, it probably works here" rules.
Generally rounded edges but not always. Typically stitched in details.

Tails!

Tails have a lot of variation when it comes to Pogo's plushies. Some are small and thin, some are long and thick, it all depends on the character, honestly.

Eyes!

There are 3 types of eyes seen on Pogo Plushies

Buttons

The most common type. They can be different shapes, sizes, colors, hole amounts, etc.

Closed Eyes


Seen on characters like [Macy](#) and [Cathy](#). Realistically these are probably either embroidery or stitched on fabric.

Fabric Eyes

Seen on [Valentino](#). This eye type is fabric stitched onto the head.

You should stick to one of these three options

Other Facial Features

These vary from character to character and have a lot of variation. They can be embroidered or stitched on fabric.



Clothing!

This can be stitched on detailing or look more like normal clothing.

Additional Details!

Other details that Pogo's plushies almost always have

- Stitched Details

These can be found on seams, joints, and pretty much wherever else things are sewn on or together.

(Markings do not HAVE to have stitched details, but most definitely can if you'd like them to)

- Stray threads/hairs/fuzz

These are typically scattered across the plush as little lines



Don't forget the tag!

Every Pogo Doll should have Pogo's signature heart tag... Like beanie babies but... scruffier!

There is no consistent location for tag placement, so just stick it in wherever you like it best!

And Now That You've Finished The Sketch...

Line and color as normal... There's no real specific way to line and color a pogo plush. Some have colored lines, some don't, it's up to your preference in that regard.

Pogo Dolls also tend to have shading, so don't forget to add that in as well!
