OSGA Resolution #FC24-026

AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution calling upon the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the Oklahoma State Government to urge the federal government to provide exemptions from the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act for medical marijuana on campus property.

WHEREAS, The Oklahoma Student Government Association is the representative body of all college students in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, People prescribed medical marijuana are currently unable to possess their prescribed medication on college campuses; and

WHEREAS, People who use their prescribed medical marijuana would be committing a federal crime by possessing it and using it; and

WHEREAS, Examples of issues that could arise from this are students who use it for anxiety disorders, prevention of seizures (especially at night), and those who use it as relief from chronic pain; and

WHEREAS, For smoked or vaporized marijuana, those prescribed are still allowed to possess them on campus, however, in accordance with the BreatheEasy regulations they are not allowed to be used on campus grounds; and

WHEREAS, For non-smoked or vaporized marijuana, those prescribed will be able to possess their medication on campus in all buildings with reasonable exception, and consumption will be allowed in their personal lodging.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION THAT:

1. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the Oklahoma State Government shall urge the federal government to provide exemptions from the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act for medical marijuana on campus property.
