## #2 – OFFICIAL NOTICE ON 4-6 ROCKWELL STREET

**WHEREAS**, the City of Hornell is desirous of safe and clean neighborhoods and strives to remove blighting influences; and

**WHEREAS**, it has come to the attention of the City of Hornell that a the dilapidated condition of a property at 4-6 Rockwell Street, Hornell, New York, has drawn numerous complaints;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the City of Hornell Board of Public Safety has given John B. Felice & Assoc, owner of record of 4-6 Rockwell Street, Hornell, New York, thirty (30) days to present a rehabilitation schedule or to immediately demolish the property; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that if John B. Felice & Assoc. fails to respond within thirty (30) days, the City will seek an order from Steuben County Supreme Court to demolish the property at 4-6 Rockwell Street, Hornell, New York, and will bill John B. Felice & Assoc. for the expense.

**ON THE QUESTION:** Mayor Hogan noted that it estimated to cost John B. Felice & Assoc. \$19,500 for repairs or \$25,000 for demolition. The City of Hornell has not heard any response back from the property owner. A copy of the official resolution will be sent to the property owner.

- Fire Chief Kelly said the new fire truck is expected to be delivered at the end of this week or the beginning of next week.
- Codes Officer Aiken said that in addition to 4-6 Rockwell St., he is working on three other blighting properties. In addition, Mayor Hogan noted there has been a good response to letters sent out to 400 rental property owners asking for proof of insurance and, if they live out of town, the name of a local agent of record.
- Police Chief Crowe said the arrest of nine individuals in a drug bust at 79 River Street “put a little bit of a dent in the drug market.”
- Mayor Hogan told commissioners that Steve Brockway has been approved for a contractor’s permit, contingent on meeting certain conditions outlined to in a May 6, 2005, letter to his attorney, Brian Schu: that Mr. Brockway act as a contractor, not broker; that he maintain ethical business practices; that he keep in full force an effective compensation and liability insurance; and that any verifiable complaints will result in permanent revocation of this permit.

- After Fire Chief Kelly's update on 9-1-1 in Steuben County, Mayor Hogan said the City should publicize the non-emergency numbers of the Hornell police and fire departments, possibly through refrigerator magnets that list the numbers.
