

Rational: As the TRBACC campaign develops, one of our most significant leadership responsibilities will be drafting and developing demands for our national campaign. While this process will require close collaboration with chapters, FORC, and the NPC, and will probably require some degree of debate, it would be best for our campaign to have some basic demands set out for purposes of clarity and prioritization in internal and external communication.

While acknowledging that this list is temporary, and can be updated, expanded or edited by the TRBACC at any time, and while also acknowledging that it is not intended to be final and is simply here to help shape broad talking points and communication, we should set some basic demands at this meeting.

Proposal:

While we will move quickly to shape wider demands as a committee, the following initial demands will be used to help shape internal and external communications.

Key demands TRBACC will campaign on will include:

1. Medicare for All: We demand a universal health care system
2. Free Abortion, on demand, without apology: We demand the right of any person who needs one to access Abortions free from danger from the state and anti-abortion fanatics
3. Free transition care, on demand, without apology: We demand the right of any person pursuing transition to receive gender affirming care free of social stigma, bans, or arduous processes designed to make them change their minds
4. Overturn all trans bans and abortion bans: We demand the immediate overturning of bans on trans healthcare, bans on abortion rights, and bans on trans participation in society
5. Union protections and housing justice for all: We demand union protections for every worker, and decent, stable housing for every person, and recognize that workplace rights and housing rights are two issues of essential importance for queer people and people who need abortions.

The tactics DSA's TRBAC will use include *may* include, but are not necessarily limited to: electoral campaigns, ballot initiatives, civil disobedience, marches, rallies, strike support, politicized mutual aid, town halls and fundraisers.
