Answers:

"Cheese Rolling" has been a (1) <u>tradition</u> in the town of Brockworth since the early 1800s.

First, the (2)<u>competitors</u> come together at the (3)<u>top</u> of Cooper's Hill and wait.

Then, someone pushes a very large (4)<u>wheel</u> of cheese down the steep (5)<u>slope</u>. And after that, things get a little wild! The cheese may reach up to 40 miles per hour. The first winner of the day is Craig Brown, a pub worker. Craig's plan was simple...
