Program Description

The Bachelor of Public Health with a Minor in Health Ministry at HBIU University prepares students to address health disparities and improve health outcomes in faith-based settings. This program integrates core public health principles, such as epidemiology, health promotion, and environmental health, with a focus on Christian ministry and faith-based health initiatives. Students will gain knowledge and practical skills to promote wellness, prevent diseases, and implement health interventions in churches, faith-based hospitals, and Christian health organizations.

The Minor in Health Ministry focuses on the role of the church and faith-based organizations in supporting health initiatives. Students will study how to integrate spiritual care with health education, and counseling, and learn to manage health-related outreach programs within faith communities. The minor prepares students to work in health ministry roles, where they can combine their passion for faith and health care to improve the overall health of individuals and communities.

Graduates of this program will be well-prepared for careers in public health organizations, church-based health ministries, community outreach programs, and health promotion initiatives.

Capstone Project (15 Credit Hours)

The capstone project serves as a culminating experience, allowing students to apply public health principles and health ministry practices in a final project.

Students will:

- Design a health ministry program for a church or faith-based organization that integrates health education and spiritual care.
- Create a program proposal for a community health initiative or church health outreach.
- Analyze challenges in providing health services within faith-based settings and propose solutions.
- Present findings and recommendations through a formal report and presentation.

This experience ensures students graduate with practical expertise in public health and health ministry.

- Gain expertise in public health, health promotion, and health ministry.
- Develop skills in health education, disease prevention, and community health management.

- Apply public health principles in faith-based organizations and church settings.
- Conduct research on the role of health ministry in churches and faith communities.
