YOUR 'GO BAG' CHECKLIST

Ensure your wildfire 'Go Bag' includes:

- A 3-day supply of non-perishable food & 3 gallons of water per person
- Necessary prescriptions and medications
- A change of clothes or two
- Extra eyeglasses/contact lenses
- Keys, credit cards, and cash
- A first aid kit, sanitation and menstrual supplies and masks for the bad air quality
- A flashlight & battery-powered radio with extra batteries
- Copies of important documents (birth certificates, passports, etc.)
- Pet food & water
