

HOW TO WRITE AN ABSTRACT FOR THIS CONFERENCE

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Abstract

Writing a high-quality abstract that complies with the official guidelines of the 5th International Indonesia Conference on Interdisciplinary Studies (IICIS) 2026 is essential for academic presenters. This paper provides an overview of how to structure and format an abstract that aligns with IICIS standards. The abstract should function as a standalone summary of a completed study or a proposed research design, comprising a single paragraph of 150 to 300 words. It must clearly present the research background, objective or problem, methodology, theoretical or conceptual framework, key findings, and conclusions or recommendations. Abstracts should be written in English, using Garamond font, 12.0 pt, single spacing, and justified alignment, without citations, abbreviations (in title), or bullet points. Authors must ensure that the title is a single, informative sentence that reflects the research focus and, if relevant, the methodology used. Author names should appear without academic degrees and be listed based on contribution. Affiliations must follow the format of department or field, institution, and country. The corresponding author must be marked with an asterisk (*) and their contact email provided. In accordance with the IICIS theme “Food Security and Strengthening Human Resources,” this example highlights the importance of clarity, structure, and adherence to submission formatting to ensure abstracts effectively represent interdisciplinary research. The goal is to assist prospective authors in preparing submissions that meet the academic and technical expectations of the conference committee.
