IOWA SCHOOL PERFORMANCE PROFILE

- Iowa's school accountability and support system was created during the development of our ESSA Plan.
- The statewide system meets federal requirements outlined in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
- ESSA focuses on school accountability and equity for all students but shifts decision-making back to states and local school districts.
- Iowa's system for accountability and support focuses attention and resources on schools that need it most and is designed to support schools, not punish them.
- Each school receives an overall score based on performances in the following areas (which are all weighted differently).
 - Student participation on state assessments
 - Academic achievement (proficiency and average scale score)
 - Student growth
 - Graduation rate
 - Postsecondary readiness
 - Progress in achieving English Language Proficiency
 - Student survey of safety and engagement (Conditions for Learning)
- A school is identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement if its overall score falls within the lowest 5 percent or graduation rate fall below 67.1%
- ESSA requires all states to publish report cards reflecting the performance of the state, schools and school districts. Iowa's report card is called the Iowa School Performance Profile.
- The Iowa Department of Education released the new results and features in an online school accountability reporting system called the <u>Iowa School Performance Profiles</u>.
- The Iowa School Performance Profiles website shows:
 - Updated scores and ratings for all public schools based on their performance on a set of accountability measures in the 2022-23 school year.
- Algona High School: Overall Rating COMMENDABLE (up from Acceptable in 2022)
- Algona Middle School: Overall Rating COMMENDABLE (same as 2022)
- Lucia Wallace Elementary: Overall Rating COMMENDABLE (same as 2022)

- Bryant Elementary: Overall Rating COMMENDABLE (same as 2022)
- Bertha Godfrey Elementary: Overall Rating COMMENDABLE (same as 2022)
- Other Highlights from the Performance Profile:
 - Algona High School's score grew by over 5 points and moved into the commendable ranking.
 - Algona Middle School grew over 3 points and maintained its Commendable Ranking.
 - The Elementary school's score remained steady, and they maintained their Commendable ranking.
- The following are areas in which we are above the State Average:
 - Average School Achievement English Language Arts
 - Average School Achievement Mathematics
 - Conditions of Learning Composite
 - Graduation Rate 4-Years
 - Graduation Rate 5-Years
 - Growth English Language Arts
 - Growth Mathematics
 - Perfect Proficient Mathematics
 - Percent Proficient English Language Arts
 - Post-secondary Readiness Index Career & Technical Education
 - Progress toward ELP Composite (this is new; we have not had an English Language Proficiency group large enough to measure in the past)
