- This legislative process will occur over the next month at both Rogers and Cave Springs City Council meetings as defined by Arkansas State code 14-40-2101. These legislative meetings are open to the public.
- Rogers values public input during this process. Concerned residents are invited to a public input session at the City Council meeting on April 23rd at 6:30pm, located at City Hall 301 W. Chestnut St.
- School system boundaries are not affected.
