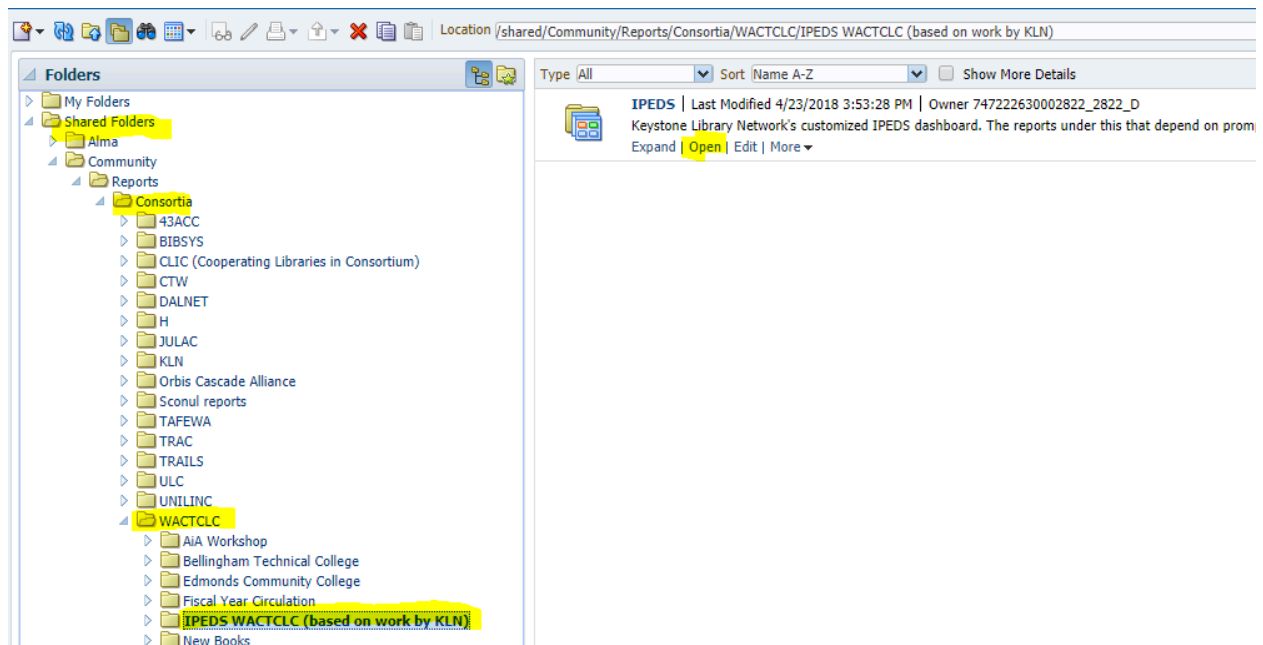

Requests in Alma

“Patron-placed requests in Alma are placed on a title. This provides the patron with an easy to understand service, and all details for getting the most appropriate copy are handled by the system, subject to institutional policies and rules. If the patron is requesting a journal title or a multi volume title (i.e. the title has item with descriptions/enum/chron) the request is then placed on the item level rather than the title level, to allow the user to select the needed item.”

Dear Colleagues,

What a month!! THREE NERS Enhancements and FIVE Idea Exchange items are part of the May release. For the first time, there are TWO ideas that come from both NERS and Idea Exchange: Moving Portfolios and the New Re-loan Limit.

Be sure to also checkout the Sneak Preview for June – where you will find more NERS and Idea Exchange items.

What's new in the May 2018 release of Alma?

Acquisitions

Trial Enhancements - The Alma Trial workflow is enhanced with a number of new features; for example, trial participants can be added based on a set of users; there is now an option to create survey questions with a closed list of responses.

Purchase Request Enhancements - The Alma Purchase Request workflow is enhanced with a number of new features; for example, there are now three new staff roles for purchase requests. Purchase requests in Primo may now be canceled by the patron.

Reply-to in Vendor Communications - It is now possible to configure a reply-to address for purchase orders and vendor communications. A new email type, Order Response,

was added to the organization unit contact information.

Resource Management

*****NERS Enhancement*** & ***Idea Exchange*** Moving Portfolios** - Local portfolios and portfolios activated from the Community Zone can be moved from their current electronic collection to another electronic collection one by one or using a set of portfolios.

*****Idea Exchange*** - Normalization for Z39.50 and SRU Records** - Bibliographic records in Alma that are retrieved using Z39.50 or SRU can be normalized prior to being presented using these protocols. For example, institutions can prevent exposure of local bibliographic information such as local notes.

*****Idea Exchange*** Physical Item Condition Field** - The physical condition of an item can now be specified using the Alma Physical Item Editor. This information can be included when publishing physical inventory and can be used as search criteria when using the Alma advanced search functions.

ISO 20775 Holdings SRU Schema - Alma's support of ISO 20775 holdings SRU schema continues to be expanded. Electronic and digital resources can now be handled; filtering by campus with the SRU query was added.

Fixed Fields Supported in Extension Packs - In addition to data fields, extension packs can now include fixed fields such as the LDR and control fields 007 and 008. This new capability also includes data fields that have fixed positions, such as 100 \$a in UNIMARC and CNMARC.

General Electronic Service Enhanced for Newspaper - The general electronic service's linking capability was enhanced with availability rules for displaying newspaper electronic collections (with no portfolios) through the Alma link resolver. In a future release this capability will be extended to the Primo View It feature.

Fulfillment

*****NERS Enhancement*** & ***Idea Exchange*** New Re-loan Limit** – You can now configure a re-loan limit, preventing patrons from re-lending items that they have just returned.

Holdings Configuration in the Get It Tab - Alma now offers expanded holdings information and customization options in the Primo Get It tab, such as enabling you to configure which of the holdings records' fields and subfields appear.

Resource Sharing

*****NERS Enhancement*** - Populate Additional Information for Articles from the DOI or PMID Fields** – When a resource sharing request form for an article is submitted with the PMID or DOI included, additional metadata will now automatically augment the request.

Analytics

Create a Set in Alma from an Alma Analytics Report - You can now create an itemized set directly from an Analytics report. This is particularly useful if you want to globally update a set of records in Alma by first retrieving these records in Alma Analytics.

Administration and Infrastructure

Search Main Menu Navigation Bar – You can now search all options in the Main Menu Navigation Bar in the persistent menu. The search returns persistent menu options, as well as configuration menu options, depending on which options are available to your user roles.

*****Idea Exchange*** Select List Size** – On some pages, you can now select the list size displayed in Alma: 20, 50, or 100.

Limiting Access to User Information – You can limit operators with certain user roles from accessing other users' information by blocking the operators' ability to search for patron information.
