1.5 Reference of Relevant Rules

MathSoc follows a modified version of Robert's Rules to help keep our meetings orderly. They prevent us from talking over each other. Please wait to be acknowledged before speaking. If you are not speaking please have your mic muted. For each speaking turn focus on a single point. Everyone has the right to speak. For a motion to be discussed it needs a "mover" and a "seconder".

If you wish to:

- Make a new point -> 1
- Reply as part of the ongoing conversation -> 2
- Ask information about the speaking order, or relevant bylaws, or policies -> POI (Point of Inquiry)
- When you see someone else not following the speaking order -> POO (Point of Order)
- If you couldn't hear or need to take a break, etc. -> POP (Point of Personal Privilege)

Most motions at Council aren't controversial so we use a method of voting where you only need to explicitly vote if you wish to vote against a motion or abstain from voting. You can also write "Noted [Name]" to have your vote noted in the minutes. We can also use roll-call voting or ballot box voting if ¾ of council agrees to it.

5 General Orders

A general order is an item of business that is ordered to be taken up at a meeting. Time limits to discussions indicate the point at which the speaker will end the discussion unless Council directs otherwise.

5.1 Conflict of Interest and Council Procedure — *President Girardin, VP Ho*

Whereas there exists a document named "Council Procedures" which details only removal of councillors and conflict of interest procedure, linked here:

Whereas removal of councillors is already specified in the bylaws, which has precedence; and



Whereas our Policies document is generally specific to Council, and it is confusing to have two distinct documents which are specific to Council, and only one that is specific to the Board; then,

Be it resolved that a new policy, *Conflict of Interest*, is added to the Policy, which describes, verbatim, the conflict of interest procedure specified in the Council Procedures document; and **Be it further resolved that** Council no longer considers the Council Procedures document as binding.

- President Girardin explains rationale redundant document.
- Motion passes unanimously.

5.2 StarCon Management Committee Dissolution — President Girardin, Councillor Neely

Whereas Policy 26, StarCon Management Committee, details the structure and procedure for a once yearly-run computer science conference event which has not been run in several years; Whereas such an event would be best run by a separate entity affiliated with MathSoc; Be it resolved that Policy 26 is rescinded.

- President Girardin: hasn't been run since 2018, shouldn't be in policy, we don't know what the conference consists of, this should be a separate thing
- VP Sood: CSC should do this
 - President Giardin: MathSoc has money
- BM Rose: The last thing that ran under StarCon was a Bayesian contest. There is a committee we should check with. There's also some funds we're holding.
 - President Girardin: StarCon Committee just consists of standing members and a chair, chair hasn't been picked
 - o BM Rose: shouldn't rescind policy, figure out what to do with funds
 - President: policy says what to do with funds
 - o BM Rose: let's just put it on the backburner, let's not lose the history that we can provide
- VP Sood: agree with Rose let's figure out the details before we take these decisions
- President Girardin: would like a slim policy document, don't see this coming up in the future, still think this should be gone
- Councillor Neely: if this is in our policy, feel like we should run it once the way we're supposed to and figure out what to do with it after that, we should make a point of following this policy once and then deciding what to do with it
- BM Rose: good idea to investigate where funds came from if it's sponsorship money then they may not like giving money to someone else
- Councillor Neely: yeah, if we run it then we can figure these things out
- Motion to table by President Girardin, Councillor Neely seconds. Motion passes unanimously, motion tabled.



5.3 Women in Mathematics Undergraduate Committee Dissolution — *President Girardin, Councillor Neely*

Whereas Policy 19, *Women in Mathematics Undergraduate Committee*, describes the structure of a committee for women in mathematics;

Whereas this has not been operational for many years (as evidenced by meeting minutes and the very, *very* old website page

(https://uwaterloo.ca/women-in-mathematics/women-mathematics-undergraduates); and

Whereas the Faculty's Women in Mathematics Committee offers many resources and services to undergraduates;

Be it resolved that Policy 19 is rescinded.

- President: hasn't been used in many years, mailing list page looks like it's from 1996. We have something similar to this in WiCS but that's not in policy. (describes purpose of committee) If WiM want a specific undergrad branch then they can do it themselves.
- Councillor Mueller: it might just be an old design
 - o President: it's HTML4
- VP Sood: have we talked to this committee? Does the faculty expect this to exist?
 - President: I very strongly suspect no
 - VP Sood: we should check, especially since it's a collaboration
 - President: they should do this similarly to WiCS
 - o BM Rose: we could just do an MoU with them like we did with WiCS
 - President: after we rescind this, we should talk to them and recommend something similar to what WiCS does that works well. This shouldn't even with MathSoc's purview, if they want something they should say so.
- Motion passes with VP Sood against, two abstaining.

5.4 Policy 32 — President Girardin, Councillor Neely

Whereas Policy 32, *Promises and Commitments* is currently specified in our Policies:

policies-public.pdf;

Whereas rules surrounding compensation are already outlined in Policy 20 and Policy 6; **Whereas** "logistics" is loosely-defined and it is often the case that logistics and planning are necessarily decided alongside a process/project; and

Whereas the remaining procedure described is mostly operational and the policy is poorly worded as a whole; then

Be it resolved that Policy 32 is rescinded.

• President: discussed this with VP Sood (bipartisan agreement), seems like an a reaction to someone doing a stupid thing. It's not worded well, it's very vague and broad, seems like it shouldn't be in policy anyway. It's too stringent and doesn't allow for things to be figured out as work progresses, eg. CnD.



- BM Rose: context: this is about some issues that came up in F19, W20 board was going through some transition that resulted in some bad decisions being made. Board has definitely improved since. We have come a long way.
- Motion passes unanimously.

5.5 DDC Capital Improvement Fund - VP Manwar, President Girardin

Whereas DDC wants to replace their office chair (missing an arm, broken tilt) with 2 new compact office chairs;

Whereas DDC requests \$400 for 2 office chairs (<\$200 each). The current plan is to purchase the following chair

Be it resolved that Council approves the \$400 under the Capital Improvement Fund.

- VP Manwar: same chair as the one we have in the exec office, they want two of them
- VP Feng: chairs in exec office are very comfortable, they are making a good investment in this chair
- President: DDC president talked to me about this, seems reasonable
- Motion passes unanimously

5.6 CSC Fund Reallocation Request - VP Manwar, VP Sood

Whereas CSC requests to reallocate \$150 from Unix 101 + Git 101 to Alt-Tab; **Whereas** It also requests to reallocate \$50 from Unix 101 + Git 101 to Discussions Group; then.

Be it resolved that Council approves this budget redistribution.

- CSC President Wang: actually want to move \$50 to Alt-Tab, \$150 to Discussions Group
- Amendment taken as friendly
- President Wang: moving money from events that we cannot hold to events that actually happen
- VP Sood: didn't Alt-Tab already happen?
 - President Wang: yes, but just in case
- President Girardin: do you not know the amounts for Alt-Tab?
 - o President Wang: someone does, I don't
- Motion passes with VP Feng abstaining due to COI with CSC

5.7 ActSci Social Cap Increase Request – *VP Manwar, President Girardin*

Whereas the Actuarial Science Club has 233 paid students;



Be it resolved that Council increases the social cap by \$1326 to \$1508

- VP Manwar: they have more members now
- Motion passes unanimously.

6 New Business

Any councillor may raise any item of concern during new business. Generally, long discussions without a specific motion before the meeting should be avoided, and are technically against the rules of procedure. If a councillor has any questions about the procedure, form, or content, they should ask the speaker.

6.1 Math Grad Chair Policy Amendment — *President Girardin, Councillor Mueller*

Whereas Policy 18.7.1, *Math Graduation Committee*, *Appointment of the Chair, General* says that "Each Chair of the Committee is to finalize their degree in the Spring or Winter term when they will be Chair."; and

Whereas this contradicts Policy 18.3, *Math Graduation Committee*, *Membership*, which specifies that any voting member can chair the committee, with strong preference given to graduating students; then

Be it resolved that Policy 18.7.1 and Policy 18.7.2 (*Procedure*) are struck, and the content of Policy 18.7 is amended to describe the current content of Policy 18.7.2.

- President Girardin: small technicality, we have a contradiction in a policy, you know how math students feel about contradictions
 - Councillor Neely: I was around for the discussion that sparked this change (Terry? wanting to be chair?) but we shouldn't amend policy to make that happen
 - President Girardin: there is still a contradiction here, I think this is out of order
 - Councillor Neely: this isn't really a contradiction, many things in policy would have contradictions if you take things literally
 - President Girardin: this is very clearly contradictory
- Motion passes with Councillor Neely against
