PHOTO PROJECT PART I: RESEARCH & INSPIRATION

- 13. Do you think the artist worked with a plan, no plan as in open to the process, or both?
- 14. How does the artist(s)' personal experience, culture, or history inform or influence their work?
- 15. What is your opinion of the artist(s)' work and why?
- 16. What else do you think is important to note about this artist(s)' work?
