- 1. Tags on projects in addition to just organizations
- 2. This year was too early, bad for Germany and Austria and the Southern Hemisphere
- 3. Provide visual resources (instead of text) to help advertise to other languages to find mentors
- 4. Encourage Googlers via 20% time to provide feedback on open source projects
- 5. Very quick turnaround between announcing orgs so they are more prepared for onboarding
- 6. Observation
  - a. A lot of people applied for the 1st project and not the 2nd project
- 7. Open Science subset of GSoC'er coalition of Open Science to make science interested students more in GSoC
- 8. Mentors had difficulties seeing feedback from evaluations. Sean had to copy and paste. It's good for mentors to see
  - a. Have checkbox on org admin side to choose whether mentor/student want their feedback shared
- 9. Have the mentor summit in Canada
  - a. No issues with visas, etc.
- 10. Consider raising the lowest bar on the stipend
- 11. Student eligibility check
  - a. Make documentation clear what do we do
- 12. Add ability to work on small hardware projects how do we
- 13. Real life meeting with mentor and student is so worthwhile can we use Google's name to help get visa letters?
- 14. Can you clarify better that GSoC Mentors are volunteers so that students treat us better?
- 15. Include open hardware in GSoC
- 16. A lot of people just don't know about GSoC. Do more or something similar to how you promote GCI
- 17. Ensure everyone goes through a code of conduct and "all communications happen publicly or it didn't happen"
  - a. Let people know when they have violated the code of conduct
- 18. I can't believe you still do this it's so painful to run
- 19. KDE has become younger and less German. We are way more Indian now. We have a lot of fresh ideas and new blood, without GSoC we wouldn't have.
- 20. How do you ensure mentors fill out the form before the deadline?
