#### Diversity and Inclusion

Some sites like RHoK India have take special interest in bringing more women to hackathon by setting aside travel grants. In 2017 we will be releasing a accessibility guide to help make the event more disabled friendly.

#### Open Knowledge

This year also saw us introducing thematic hackathons apart from the regular global summer and winter events. The purpose of these events is to understand local ecosystems and issues and creating a knowledge bank of similar issues around the world. These hackathon henceforth will not only release open solutions but also material to have an in depth understanding of certain global issues and foster exchange

Hackathon Against Gender Based Violence



RHoK India hosted a Hackathon against gender based Violence in January this year. This hackathon was the first of thematic global events by the community. The event brought together gender activists and community member from USA and India to come together and write solutions to this complex issue.

### Nepal Mini MakerFaire

# **IMPLEMENTATION**

This year also saw a lot of RHoK Hacks go live in various parts of the world. Here are some of those efforts

## MSF Appointment Reminder

A team from RHoK Belgium built an appointment reminder system to remind patients suffering from TB and HIV of their medication. With the initial prototype they approached MSF who supported this project to completion and deployed the pilot to the population of Epsworth in Zimbabwe in 2015. It has been ever since successfully reminding the travelling patient population of their medication. This year the hack passed the proof of concept to be implemented in more centers in Zimbabwe

#### **HiveSense**

The HiveSense platform is a Remote beehive monitoring platform built in RHoK June 2016 event in Ottawa. The ambitious project was built to monitor hives in winters of Canada and is presently being piloted in various places

#### Spur Projects

Men aged 80+ suicide at a rate twice the national average. Oldmate is a project by spur projects to encourage 100,000 Australians to take a pledge to spend one hour per month with an Old Mate in their life. This project went live during the RHoK June 2016 in Brisbane and is accepting pledges since then
