

**Structured Pictures** brings order to visual research.


Many people store image references in folders on their computer. Structured Pictures embraces that and allows you to view and manage them easily.

### What is Structured Pictures

- A tool to view and manage your image references.
- To start, copy your existing files and folders to Dropbox > Apps > Structured Pictures.

### How It Works

- Acts as a bridge between your Dropbox and your browser.
- Detects your existing Dropbox file structure and formats appropriately.
- Manage files in Structured Pictures or on your desktop.



### Aims

- Do one thing, really well.
- Keep it simple.
- Embrace existing workflows, don't force new ones.

### Your Data

- Your content is stored on your Dropbox, not on our servers.
- Keep your images accessible, not in a proprietary locked-down system.
- We only ask for access to our own folder, not your whole Dropbox.

### **Anti-Social**

- Structured Pictures is not a social network.
- Reference libraries are a blueprint for your creative thinking, and it's OK to keep that private.

### **Future**

- This is beta software, and you should keep backups of all files.
- We may charge a fee to use Structured Pictures in the future.
