Course Description and Summer Assignment

Spanish AP **Syllabus**

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course emphasizes communication (understanding and being understood by others) by applying the interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational modes of communication in real-life situations. This includes vocabulary usage, language control, communication strategies, and cultural awareness. The AP Spanish Language and Culture course strives not to overemphasize grammatical accuracy at the expense of communication. To best facilitate the study of language and culture, the course is taught almost exclusively in Spanish. A redesigned AP Spanish Language and Culture course and exam launched in Fall 2019. The new course is comparable to fourth semester (or the equivalent) college courses in Spanish.

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course engages students in an exploration of culture in both contemporary and historical contexts. The course develops students' awareness and appreciation of cultural products (e.g., tools, books, music, laws, conventions, institutions); practices (patterns of social interactions within a culture); and perspectives (values, attitudes, and assumptions). The course objectives are to help students:

- → understand Spanish spoken by native speakers at a natural pace, with a variety of regional pronunciations, in both informal (interpersonal) and formal (presentational) contexts
- → develop an active vocabulary sufficient for reading newspaper and magazine articles, contemporary literature, and other non-technical writings (websites, letters and emails, advertisements, signs and instructions) in Spanish without dependence on a dictionary (interpretive)
- → express themselves by describing, narrating, inquiring, and developing arguments in Spanish, both orally and in writing, with reasonable fluency, using different strategies for different audiences and communicative contexts (presentational).

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In this course, special emphasis is placed on the use of authentic source materials and the integration of language skills. Therefore, students will receive extensive training in combining listening, reading, and speaking (or listening, reading, and writing) skills in order to demonstrate understanding of authentic Spanish-language source materials.

Your signature on the James Bowie High School Course Contract indicates your understanding of the commitment to succeed in this course and your acknowledgment of the required summer assignment. May you enjoy your summer adventure in learning!

AP Spanish 4 is a very interesting but intense course. You will have to speak, read, and write in Spanish 100% of the time. These summer assignments will keep your skills sharp and help you to prepare.

One assignment from each part (A,B,C,D) will be graded during the first week of the 2021 2022 school year; you are strongly advised to complete one from each section over the summer and keep them in a google folder to start the year with as little stress as possible. Reading and Writing optional at the bottom.

Parte A:

Create Your Own Practice Assignment

For your first oral grade of the school year, you will be asked about how you kept your Spanish language alive during the summer. You will be expected to talk for 60-90 seconds saying 10 sentences. Your response can be totally fictional, so don't let reality limit yourself. Take artistic license. You may want to talk about dreams, visitors from another planet, a top-secret spy mission...

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Parte B:

Escucha y escribe (compara y contrasta) con podcasts, programas, música

One of the expectations in the AP Spanish Language and Culture is to understand the significance of an array of cultural products, practices and perspectives from around the Spanish-speaking world and make comparisons of them to those in your own community. One of the best ways to keep your brain actively engaged with Spanish is to give it sessions to be immersed in the language. To me, there's no better way to do that than to listen and watch Spanish-language programs and music. 
