

## EA Wikia Skeleton

Proposal: The EA Wikia Library (<http://effective-altruism.wikia.com/wiki/Library>) is currently structured in a way that makes it really useful for people researching EA ideas (“here’s a list of organizations that could come under the label EA”) and not useful for people trying to learn more about EA (In particular, who need a comprehensive intermediate guide to EA - EA 201, if you will, after reading the 101 resources).

I want to turn this library into an EA 201 resource / something people can go to when they need resources to send to friends, when they find a really good EA-esque article that others might not naturally stumble upon, or when they want to learn more about a specific topic. Here’s a skeleton for how to organize the page according to those goals:

1. Introduction to EA
  - a. Collection of EA 101 readings
  - b. Articles and media on EA
  - c. Overview of EA community and affiliated organizations
2. Cause areas
  - a. Poverty

    - ii. Specific debates or sources of controversy

Some potential problems:

- Related: How to format?
  - Something like a heading > subheading > bullet points with reviews underneath style sounds like a solid way to start. So wikipedia style formatting with bullet points in place of paragraphs.
- How detailed?
  - A solid contents page / organizational framework should solve most of the problems of over detailedness I think. But what precisely constitutes EA stuff? Maybe that should be a problem we solve once/if it gets to be an issue but before then let everyone post whatever.
  - Ideally we want to make a list of all the things that could possibly come under EA subheadings, and then during community meetups (like wiki a thon) we can delegate people to find and read links under each of the subheadings and update the wiki accordingly.
