Tests, assessments, and quizzes. These words may make our children feel nervous. 20 years ago, the assessment had been used solely for calculating overall final grades. Today, at TCIS, guided by educational research, assessment is used to improve student learning and achievement. Parents play an important role in their child's education; when parents, students, and educators work together, students are successful! When your child receives their test back, review it with them. Wrong answers should not be shunned. Instead, use it as data on what your child can focus their studying on. Also, celebrate the correct answers. Ask your child to teach you or explain how they knew the answer. This reflective skill enhances learning. It gives time to synthesize and gain a deeper understanding of important points.

NWEA MAP Testing



The first week of MAP testing is complete, and all students will finish next week. On September 29-30 we will have make-up sessions for those absent or did not finish. Once results are available, teachers can use the data to help guide class instructions. We will then share the results with students so they can set goals and use assessment data to take ownership of their learning. Parents will also receive a report and explanation of the data in October. Teachers will be available during Parent Teacher Conference to explain the results in detail.

PSAT Testing



Students in Grade 8 will receive support from their English teacher to create a College Board account and prepare for Practice SAT exams in November. To succeed on exams, students must understand what questions will be asked, how to use the interface, and learn test-taking strategies. English teachers will begin incorporating this into lessons, so students are confident and well prepared. After they receive their results, teachers will show students how to use their scores to focus on their goals.





Keeping Your Child Safe at TCIS

Student Computers

The Faculty and Administration believe technology is a powerful and integral part of the TCIS instructional program. While there are many good computers on the market, please understand that <u>PC/Windows-based</u> computers are not supported for academics at TCIS.

1) TCIS Secondary School is a MacBook/iPad one-to-one school

MacBooks or IPads are required for all grades 7 through 12 students

2) TCIS Chromebook Rental for Grades 5-6

- a) School-owned Chromebooks are rented daily for grades 5 & 6 students if needed.
- b) Grade 5-6 students can opt out of the school-owned Chromebooks if they have their own MacBook or iPad.
- c) Students in Grades 5-6 must use Apple iPad or Macbook if they are using a personal device
- d) Students will be using Google Classroom and various websites for school work. We do recommend a laptop but an Apple iPad is fine to use. iPads have some limitations.

TCIS Approved Devices - 2022-2023 School Year

- Grade 7-12 MacBooks or iPads (student-owned)
- Grade 5-6 Chromebooks (school-owned) **or** MacBooks / iPads (student-owned)
- PC/Windows-based computers are not supported for academics at TCIS.

Hair Color Requirement

It is a requirement that students at the TCIS maintain their natural hair color. Other colors (including highlights, shading, etc.) are not acceptable. While students enjoy trying new things in Secondary School, hair color is not one of those things that we allow students to experiment with.


Section 5.4-2 (page 29) of the Student-Parent Handbook (Uniform and Appearance) regarding hair color:

Hairstyles, if considered inappropriate for students in a school setting, will not be allowed. Hair, even if colored, should be of natural hair color or hue.

Hair Styles Not Permitted at TCIS for Students from PK2 to Grade 12

Images such as lightning bolts are not shaved into a student's hair (example: Image 1). Hair must be kept as the student's natural color. Dyed, highlighted, bleached, or colored hair is not permitted at TCIS (examples: Images 2 & 3).







Food Delivery

To maintain student and teacher safety, the campus is closed to food deliveries (for everyone). Plan to bring everything with you in the morning. Parents/visitors who wish to enter campus are asked to schedule an appointment through the registrar.

- Masks must be worn at all times, including in the classroom.
- Students' temperature is checked upon entrance.
- Late students must check in <u>with the Registrar</u> to receive an "Admit to Class" slip. The registrar is located in the main lobby of the middle school.
- Students must use hand sanitizer before entering school and before entering each classroom.
- Students must sanitize any shared classroom materials/supplies after each use.
- Students sanitize their desks before leaving every class, with the provided supplies.
- Students must remain socially distant at all times.
- No more than 4 students in the restroom at any given time.
- Students may take their backpacks into their classroom to avoid groups at the lockers.
- Students may wear a face shield <u>as well as a mask</u> but not instead of a mask.
- Lunch (Students' temperature is checked upon entrance to the canteen before lunch.

Visiting the Campus

Parents/visitors who wish to visit campus are asked to schedule an appointment through the registrar or with Ms. Ooy. They will follow up on your request. The appointments must be confirmed via email before parents enter the campus.

Please book an appointment with Ms. Ooy to meet with the Head of Middle School at least 24 hours in advance. Meeting hours are 11:00 am - 4:00 pm.

Reporting Student Absences and Tardies

Please notify the registrar as soon as possible of your child's absence or tardiness from school.

A parent or guardian must email the Registrar within one day following the absence.

Excused Absences

For an Absence to be Excused, a parent must email/call in the absence within 24 hours. The reason for the absence must be supported by the factors outlined in the attendance policy:

- Illness with medical documentation
- observation or celebration of a religious holiday
- recovery from an accident with medical documentation
- required court attendance with court notice
- death in the family
- other absences that may be deemed acceptable by the Head of Schools or Designee

Unexcused Absences

If a parent does not email/call in the absence, the student is marked as absent without excuse.

Birthday Cupcake Procedures



At TCIS, we understand that children and parents wish to celebrate birthdays with classmates. It is a big day! While we do allow children to bring in cupcakes to share with classmates, we do have procedures in place that need to be followed.

Please note, no soda, no full birthday cakes, or candles are allowed, as it takes too much time for us to cut and distribute cake to students and to clean up. Of course, candles are dangerous and present a serious fire risk.

These steps need to be followed:

- The cupcakes must come to school with the student when he/she arrives at school.
 Deliveries are not allowed under any circumstances.
- The cupcake will be given to Ms. Ooy or Mr. Richard in the morning and kept in their office
- Do not provide any knives to your child to cut the cupcakes.
- Cupcakes will be distributed only at lunchtime by the student
- No loss of class instructional time will be allowed due to the celebration

No Food Deliveries Allowed

No food deliveries are allowed to TCIS at any time during the school day. If a student forgot his/her lunch, do not worry, we will make sure to take care of them on that day. However, please do make sure your child has money on his/her card to use in the canteen.






You will see your entire family on this screen. Student currently being viewed is to the left. Other student(s) are to the right.




You will see your entire family on this screen. Student currently being viewed is to the left. Other student(s) are to the right.




Below, you'll see a list of the student's courses, recent scores, and attendance. Please note that you can change the Quarter you're viewing.

Choose the class and see all assignments and grades











Once you have downloaded the app, you'll need to register




Once you enter your password, your student(s) will appear.
