

I created this ride in response to Laura Carson's (Artfully Musing) challenge to create an additional piece for the Halloween Carnival. It resembles a Zipper carnival ride. It does not have all the movement of the actual ride, but when it turns on the central access point the cauldrons swing and turn. NOTE: The measurements are based on using plastic cauldrons of a specific size and it was a very close fit using the measurements I captured in the steps below. Please check for fit as you go along and make adjustments as needed

Supplies - these are the items I used in my version

- 6 black plastic cauldrons (app 2 1/4" tall (without handle) x 2 3/4" wide -3 1/2" tall with handle)
- 12 wide craft sticks (app 3/4" x 6")
- 6 narrow craft sticks (app 1/4" x 7 1/2")
- 5 mm skewers 6 pieces app 5"
- 2 wood wheels with 1/4" center hole
- 1/4" dowel at least 6"
- 2 knobs that fit on 1/4" dowel
- 12 small wheels or wood parts that fit over
 5 mm skewer
- 3 pieces 12" x 12" chipboard (I used black so I wouldn't have to paint the edges)
- 2 ATC Gothic Tombstones
- Small amount of moss
- 2 Skeleton Hands Food Picks

- Alcohol inks to color hands
- Wood Rectangle for base app 6 1/2" x 9
 1/2" (at least 6" x 9" on top)
- Cauldron filling I used fall colored Mylar tinsel but anything can be used
- decorative paper
- foam core
- 6 washers with app 3/8" hole
- 6 washers with hole slightly bigger than 1/4"
- white glue
- strong glue (I used Beacon Quick Grip)
- Paint in desired colors
- Distress Ink for paper edges
- Copper Gilders Paste
- Alphabet die
- Glossy Accents

Images from Laura Carson (Artfully Musing)

- Ghosts from Halloween Carnival Rides Digital Download cut 12
 - Vary sizes from 1 ½" to 2"
 - Flip some horizontal to vary appearance
- 13th Hour Clock Purple from Halloween Carnival Digital Download cut 4
 - Resize to 2.3" and cut out ot cut with 2" circle punch
- P130721potions-12 (Transylvanian Bat Fangs) from Potions & Poisons Download cut 2
 - Resize to 3" wide and remove central piece
- Beware Vampires from Carnival Rides Digital Download cut 2
 - Crop to keep just "Beware"
 - Resize to 1 ½" wide

Other Image - "Zombie Zipper" - need 2

- Create in MS Word or other word processing (or write by hand)
- Maximum size for words about ½" tall by 1 ½" wide (I used Wide Latin font size 16)
- Overall size 7/8" x 2 ½"

Tools

- Crop-o-dile
- Scissors
- 1/4" heavy duty punch
- Saw or cutters to cut dowels
- Sandpaper
- Craft Knife with new blade
- Sanding tool
- Wood clothespins or other small clamps
- Optional 2" circle punch
- Optional small round file

Steps

1. Prepare Pieces

a. Images

- i. Cut out images
- ii. All images except ghosts back with black cardstock
- iii. Ghosts
 - 1. Cut out ghosts
 - 2. Paint narrow craft sticks to match cauldron filling
 - 3. Cut into 12 pieces app 3 ½" long
 - 4. Glue one end to back of ghost
 - 5. Cover back with white cardstock
 - 6. Trim white cardstock even with ghost on front

b. Cauldrons

- i. Add Gilders Paste
- ii. Pop off one side of handle, add large washer, reconnect handle

c. Craft stick supports (12 total)

- i. Paint as desired
- ii. Punch large Crop-o-dile hole no more than 3/8" from one end (centered) go easy so stick doesn't crack
- iii. Cut four to 4 1/4" (I used a craft knife for this)

d. Zipper

- i. Cut 4 pieces of chipboard @ 2 ¾" x 8". Pay attention to the grain. You want the pieces to be stiff, so making sure you are cutting perpendicular to the bendable sde.
- ii. Paint edges if not using black chipboard
- iii. Use a 2 3/4" circle template to round both ends of all pieces
- iv. Sand edges if desired
- v. Cover two pieces with decorative paper to be seen from the outside (outside pieces) ink edges if desired. On the plain side of each piece, write Side A (B) OUTSIDE.
- vi. Cover two pieces with decorative paper to be seen from the inside (inside pieces) ink edges if desired. On one side of each piece, write Side A (B) INSIDE

- vii. Punch a ¼" hole in the center (horizontally and vertically) of both pieces.
- viii. Use the zipper template to mark placement of popsicle sticks on the unfinished side of Side A INSIDE piece (just this one side needs to be marked)
- e. **Supports** (note basically the same as Laura's Ferris Wheel supports)
 - i. Cut 6 pieces of chipboard @ 4" x 12". Pay attention to the grain. You want the pieces to be stiff, so making sure you are cutting perpendicular to the bendable sde.
 - ii. Paint edges if not using black chipboard
 - iii. Mark a center point for the ¼" hole by measuring down ¾" from one short edge and centered.
 - iv. Punch the ¼" hole in each piece where marked. Note: If you have a drill and can make a hole through three pieces of chipboard at once, you don't need to punch individual holes
 - v. Now create the modified trapezoid shape
 - 1. Make tick marks on one short end, 1" in from each side.
 - 2. Make tick marks 2" up from bottom on opposite end
 - 3. Make a line to connect the tick marks
 - 4. Cut on each line (create 6 identical pieces)
 - 5. Round the top corners (and bottom corners if desired)
 - vi. Cover two pieces with decorative paper to be seen from the outside ink edges if desired
 - vii. Cover two pieces with decorative paper which will be seen on the inside ink edges if desired
 - viii. Make two support "sandwiches" by gluing 3 pieces together- Inside, plain middle and outside, making sure to keep the 1/4" holes aligned.
 - ix. Allow to dry thoroughly
 - x. Sand edges
 - xi. If you skipped making individual ¼" holes in step (e-iv) drill them now.
 - xii. Test fit the $\frac{1}{4}$ " dowel it should be able to turn easily in the holes but not be too loose- if not use a round file to modify size until just large enough

f. Wood Pieces

- i. Cut 6 5mm skewers to length (cauldron supports). Length = $3 \frac{1}{4}$ " PLUS thickness of two popsicle sticks PLUS thickness of two pieces of chipboard PLUS thickness of small wheels. Better to have too long than too short. Mine were $4 \frac{1}{4}$ " long
- ii. Paint all wood pieces as desired
- g. Create stoppers (used to prevent the cauldron from "wandering" too much
 - i. Cut 12 chipboard ½" by ½" from scraps
 - ii. Punch large Crop-o-Dile hole in center
 - iii. Round corners
 - iv. Paint black if not using black chipboard

2. Assembly

- a. Zipper
 - i. Step 1 Side A INSIDE
 - Place 6 popsicle sticks on inside of zipper piece you marked with the template
 - 2. Use strong glue to attach the popsicle sticks
 - 3. Allow to dry
 - ii. Step 2 Side B INSIDE
 - 1. With popsicle stick side of Side A facing down, align Side B INSIDE with Side A INSIDE (Paper sides are facing each other)
 - 2. Draw some guidelines to help with glue placement
 - 3. For each of 6 additional popsicle sticks:
 - a. Lay down a line of glue
 - b. Align the new Side B popsicle stick with its partner on Side A
 - c. Clamp with clothespin to hold in place
 - 4. Allow to dry
 - iii. Step 3 Complete Zipper Sides
 - 1. Using strong glue
 - a. ALIGN and attach Side A OUTSIDE to Side A INSIDE
 - b. ALIGN and attach Side B OUTSIDE to Side B INSIDE
 - 2. Allow to dry
 - 3. Use strong glue to attach a wood wheel to the OUTSIDE of both pieces, centered on the ½" hole
 - 4. Allow to dry
 - iv. Attach cauldron swings (6)
 - 1. Temporarily fit ½" dowel through center of the zipper sides, using clothespins to keep it in place. DO NOT GLUE at this time
 - 2. Dry fit for each cauldron swing in this order:
 - a. Decorative wood piece
 - b. Go through first popsicle stick
 - c. Chipboard stopper
 - d. Large washer with cauldron hanging from it
 - e. Chipboard stopper
 - f. Go through second popsicle stick
 - g. Decorative wood piece
 - When satisfied with fit and alignment with other cauldrons, glue each cauldron assembly in place (except washer holding cauldron so it can swing)

b. Attach Zipper to Supports

- i. Dry fit first
 - 1. Add two washers to each side of the 1/4" dowel
 - 2. Place the two supports on either side
 - 3. Add another washer
 - 4. Add a turning knob to each end
 - 5. Distance between the sides of the zipper at the central point should be the same as under the cauldron swings
- Mark and cut 1/4" dowel to length ii.
 - 1. There needs to be only a tiny space in between the knob and the support only enough so that the zipper can turn freely
 - 2. Allow for length of dowel inside of each turning knob
 - 3. Mark length
 - 4. Measure width between the two supports
 - 5. Rotate zipper and check to see if 3 or 4 pieces of foam core can fit between the lowest hanging cauldron and the base
 - 6. Separate assembly
 - 7. Cut off dowel to marked length
- iii. Create Step Assembly (note basically the same as Laura's Ferris Wheel steps)

- 1 @ 4" by width from above
 1 @ 4 3/4" by width from above
 1 @ 4 1/2" by width from above
 1 @ 5 1/2" by width from above

 - 1 @ 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by width from above
- 1. Cover one side of each with decorative paper (note save some paper on the underneath steps - only a small section shows)
- 2. Build steps from bottom up, centering each step and use strong glue to attach
- 3. Center on base so the steps face the short sides
- 4. Allow to dry
- Glue assembly iv.
 - 1. Center dowel in zipper
 - 2. Glue to zipper wheels (the dowel is fixed to the zipper)
 - 3. Allow to dry
 - 4. Add two washers to each side
 - 5. Place the supports
 - 6. Add another washer to each side
 - 7. Glue the knobs on the dowel (careful don't glue to the support or the zipper won't turn)
 - 8. Allow to dry
 - 9. Glue entire zipper assembly to wood base

c. Fill the cauldrons

- i. Add mylar tinsel or other desired filling
- ii. Add the ghost passengers
 - 1. Trim the popsicle sticks to length and insert the ghosts
 - 2. Make sure they fit within the handle of the cauldron or they will interfere with the cauldron's ability to swing

d. Decorate

- i. Add the collage elements to the Zipper and supports
- ii. Create the Zombie elements
 - 1. Paint the ATC Gothic tombstones following Laura's instructions for "Dodge a Zombie" game
 - Optional Cut out "RIP" from orange paper using Tim Holtz "Typeset" die and attach and highlight with Glossy Accents
 - 2. Use purple, green and black alcohol inks to tint the plastic hands
 - 3. Cut a small piece of black foam core for in front of the tombstone
 - 4. Cut the plastic hand to length
 - 5. Cut a slit in the foam core
 - 6. Glue the hand in the foam core
 - 7. Glue tombstone to zipper support (I backed with black chipboard to make it stand out)
 - 8. Glue foam core with hand in front of tombstone
 - 9. Add moss around hand and to cover foam core
- iii. Add other embellishments as desired
