3. The link will take you to this slide with images representing the seven soft skills. Students have to decide which image goes with which soft skill and then count how many of those images there are



Clues to Solve	1. Students will have to solve the Rebus puzzle by typing the correct word in each text box







2. In each box the students will have to guess what word(s) the emoji(s) is/are showing and then change the letters based on the clues given. For example, in the first box it shows a hand.



The clue says to make the letter 'n' in hand equal to 'r'. This would change the word to "hard".

- 3. At the end of the puzzle students should spell out the following message in the text boxes "hard skills = technical skills, training, and education".
- 4. The clue that pops up when a correct puzzle is submitted is the key to the 23 letter lock "hardskillsandsoftskills"
