With every answer the employment counselor can simply use an online search engine and type: 'jobs that involve [the words in the clients answer]' to get a listing of jobs that match the clients answers.

This questionnaire can also be used to assess natural criminality, natural life problems, and more...

- What novels do you like to read? Give their name and a short summary. And also tell what careers or jobs the characters have.

- If you were to contact the news about something happening in the community or your life, what would you contact the news about?

- **Security & Defense:**

- What passwords would you use that you have not already used before? (and don't write a password that you actually intend to really use in the future)

- What security questions do you or would you use?

- **Contentedness & Happiness:**

- What makes you content?

- What makes you happy?

- **Products you Buy:**

- What product types do you buy the most of?

- What is the art on products you buy? (Their names, logos and the marketing on or of them.) How are they advertised in commercials?

- **Products you Would Create:**

- If you could create a new product, what type of product would it be? What would be its use? What would be its name and its logo? How would you advertise it?

- **Businesses you Shop in:**

- If you wanted to buy stocks in a company, what type of business would you buy stock in?

- What businesses do you shop in the most?

- What is the art of the businesses you shop in? (Their names, logos, the marketing on or of them, the art on their walls.) How are they advertised in

commercials?

● **Businesses you Would Create:**

- If you could create any business right now, what type of business would it be?

What would you sell? What would be its name and its logo? How would you advertise it? Where would you place its location?

- What do you think about your city?

Questionnaire for Natural Employment B:

Arts & Entertainment:

Movies, T.V. Shows, Novels:

People's preferred movies, t.v. shows, and novels' main characters:

- careers
- life situations

display their own most natural employment. Also, people's favorite actors/actresses (and all the careers they act out in movies) display their natural employment.

Careers of the characters:

People's preferred movies, t.v. shows, and novels' main characters' careers display their own most natural employment. Also, people's favorite actors/actresses (and all the careers they acted out in movies and t.v. shows) and novelists (and all the main character's careers they wrote about) display their natural employment.

- For example, if a person's:
 - favorite character in their favorite movie is a doctor, then the person's natural employment is a doctor.
 - preferred t.v. shows have characters with employments like teacher, scientist, and other middle class occupations, then the person's natural employment is as a teacher, a scientist or other middle class occupations.
 - often chooses novels about spies or other political employments like journalist, elections speech writer, president, etc..., then the person's natural employment is in a political occupation similar to those.

Life situation of the characters:

People's preferred movies, t.v. shows, and novels' main characters' life stories/problems (or the plots of the movies, t.v. shows or novels) display their own most natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - has a favorite novel where the character is going through a healthcare problem, then the person's natural employment is in healthcare.
 - often chooses movies where the main characters are going through romance in their lives, then the person's natural employment is in romance.
 - prefers t.v. shows where the characters are going through taking care of children, then the person's natural employment is in childcare.

** What are your favorite (or favorite types of) movies, t.v. shows, and novels? What are the main characters' careers? What are the life situations of the main characters (or the movie's, t.v. show's, and novels plots)?*

Video Games, Board Games & Other Interactive Games:

The activities performed in people's favorite video games, board games, and other interactive games display their most natural employment.

- For example, if a person enjoys playing a:
 - video game about war, then the person's natural employment is in war
 - board game is involving construction, then the person's natural employment is in construction.
 - sudoku, dominos, or other games involving simple math, then the person's natural employment is in simple mathematics.

** What are your favorite video games, board games, and other interactive games? What are the activities performed in them?*

Magazines:

The magazines that people read or like and the articles in them that they like most display their most natural employment. Also, the advertisements in those magazines also display their most natural employment.

- For example, if a person likes magazines about:
 - beauty, then the person's natural employment is in beauty
 - business, then the person's natural employment is in business
 - homemaking, then the person's natural employment is as a homemaker

** What magazines do you like or often read? What are their articles about? What advertisements are found in them?*

Songs:

The lyrics and topics of people's favorite songs, and the scenes in their music videos, display their most natural employment.

- For example, if a person likes or often listens to songs about:
 - helping people, then the person's natural employment is in helping people.
 - politics, then the person's natural employment is as a politician.
 - romance, then the person's natural employment is in romance.

** What are your favorite songs? What topics are they about? What are the scenes in their music videos? Which careers are displayed, if any?*

Paintings, Photos, Sculptures, Drawings:

The objects, people, or actions in people's favorite paintings, photos, sculptures, and drawings display their most natural employment.

- For example, if a person likes paintings, photos, or sculptures of:
 - a person dancing, then the person's natural employment is in dancing.
 - animals, then the person's natural employment is with the animal.
 - children, then the person's natural employment is with children.

** What paints, photos, and sculptures do you like most? Who or what is in them? What actions, if any, are being displayed?*

Recreational Activities:

All the recreational activities that people choose to do, alone or with others, display their most natural employment. And so does where people choose to do their recreation.

- For example, if a person likes to spend a lot of their free time:
 - eating or going out to eat, then the person's natural employment is in food.
 - exercising in the woods, then the person's natural employment is in exercise and/or in or with the woods.
 - watching and reading the news, then the person's natural employment is in the news.

** What recreational activities do you do or like to do the most? What do you prefer to do in your free time for recreation?*

Conversation Topics:

What people talk about the most often or what conversations they are able to have back and forth with someone else who initiates a conversation (and exactly what they decide to say to that person initiating a conversation) displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person talks mostly about:
 - beauty like hair, skin, makeup, diet, exercise, clothing, then the person's natural employment is in beauty.
 - sex, then the person's natural employment is in sex.

- reforming the government, then the person's natural employment is in government reform

** What do you talk about the most often? What do you like to talk about the most?*

Life Assistance of Others:

How people life assist others in need, displays their own natural employment. Fields in which to assist people include food, transportation, healthcare, law, security, housing, immigration, communications, directions, clothing, hygiene, news, delivery, and much more...

- For example, if a person often gives:
 - healthcare advice or assistance (like CPR or bandaids) then the person's natural employment is in healthcare.
 - legal advice or assistance, then the person's natural employment is in law.
 - clothing to others, then the person's natural employment is with clothing.

** How do you life assist others?*

Locations for Spending Free Time:

Which locations people spend much of their time displays their natural employment. This includes the actual businesses the person sits in and the business types that are also nearby or surrounding where they are.

- For Example, if a person spends much of their free time in:

- parks which are nearby restaurants, then the person's natural employment is in parks and in restaurants.
- restaurants or cafes doing activities, such as reading newspapers, novels or working, searching the internet, chatting online, making phone calls, etc.... then the person is naturally employed in a restaurant or cafe.
- open government watching politics and nearby it inside the other businesses, then the person's natural employment is in politics.

** Which locations (or businesses) do you spend most of your time? Which locations (or businesses) do you prefer to spend your free time?*

Volunteer Places & Duties:

The business fields that people decide to volunteer in and the job duties that people perform while volunteering display their natural employment. What people choose to do for free has always been the best display of their natural employment. An exception for when volunteering activities will not show people's natural employment is if someone else chose the volunteering experience for them, and not themselves.

- For example, if a person volunteers:
 - to do neighborhood watch, acting as free security for their neighborhood's protection, then the person's natural employment is in security, say as a security guard or as a police officer.
 - as a school tutor, then the person's natural employment is in education, say as a teacher.
 - as a cleaner, then the person's natural employment is as a janitor

** Where do you, or would you, volunteer? What activities do you do, or would you do, as a volunteer?*

Thought Topics:

What people think about in their minds throughout the day and night, while on the job, or in their free time, displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person thinks about:
 - babies or children most of the day, then the person's natural employment is with babies or children.
 - committing crime all day, then the person's natural employment is as a criminal.
 - natural disasters, then the person's natural employment is with natural disasters.

** What thoughts do you have the most often? What do you usually find yourself thinking about?*

Photos & Videos:

What photos & videos people take, like, put on display or keep at their home, on their social media, or in their phones or computers, display their natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - likes to take photos of flowers, then the person's natural employment is with flowers.
 - likes to take videos of homelessness, then the person's natural employment is with homelessness.
 - has photos of people with guns or weapons on display in their home and on their social media page, then the person's natural employment is in jobs requiring a gun or weapon, like police, body guard, soldier, assassin, hunter, shooting range worker, etc.,.

** What photos and videos do you find yourself taking the most often? What photos and videos do you prefer to take?*

Blog Topics:

What people blog about on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, Wordpress, or whatever other social media website, displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person posts:
 - news articles constantly, then the person's natural employment is in the news.
 - about cars and trucks, then the person's natural employment is with transportation.
 - about foreign travel, then the person's natural employment is in foreign travel, such as a travel agent.

** What do you blog about online? What are your posts about?*

Vacation & Holiday Activities:

What people do on vacation displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person spends vacation or holiday time:
 - reading novels, magazines, newspapers, etc.. then the person's natural employment is with reading & writing.
 - traveling, then the person's natural employment is in traveling.
 - helping people, then the person's natural employment is in helping people, doing what they do on their vacation in their real job.

** What do you do, or prefer to do, on vacations and holidays?*

Home & Office Decor:

How people artistically decorate their homes or offices display their natural employment. This includes paintings on the walls; photos on the walls and on the tables; book, movies, music C.D.s, magazines, board games, video games, etc.. left on display or out for others to see; sculptures and figurines; colors of the furniture, curtains, other fabrics, walls, cabinets, etc...; art on the kitchen, or eating and drinking ware; and more... Exceptions for when the decor is not their own natural employment is when someone else decorated their home or office for them.

- For example, if a person displays:
 - photos of the environment all over the walls, on their blankets and curtains, and on their kitchen ware, then the person's natural employment is with the environment.
 - animals on their walls, like deer and fish, and books and magazines about wildlife and hunting, then the person's natural employment is as an animal hunter.
 - politics all over like a photo of themselves standing with the mayor, the governor and the president; funny political cartoons on display; and local and national newspapers on tables and shelves; C-SPAN on a drinking mug; book biographies of presidents on display; political magazines in a rack, etc... then the person's natural employment is in politics.

** How do you decorate your home? Describe it. How do you decorate your office space?*

Describe it.

Gifts Given:

The gifts that people give others often display their own natural employment.

Exceptions of when a gift given does not display the gift giver's natural employment are when the person is somewhat good at giving gifts and only gives gifts of what the other person likes and instead of what they themselves like or when someone else chooses the gift to give for them.

- For example, if a person gives someone the gift of:
 - jewelry, then the person's natural employment is in jewelry.
 - a prepaid credit card to spend the money as they wish, then the person's natural employment is with money or credit, like as a credit card company worker.
 - food or gift cards to restaurants, then the person's natural employment is in restaurants.

** What gifts do you give others?*

Investments & Donations:

What people invest in or what donations people give and to where displays their own natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - buys stocks in a construction company, then the person's natural employment is in construction.
 - gives donations to a technology-based company, then the person's natural employment is in technology.
 - invests in a retail store, then the person's natural employment is in retail stores of the same type they invested in.

** What have you invested in or donated to in the recent past? What would you invest in or donate to if you could?*

Complaints & Dislikes:

What people complain about most often or dislike displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person complains about or dislikes:
 - the cleanliness of a place or person often, then the person's natural employment is in cleaning, such as a janitor.
 - the behavior of other people being wrong, then the person's natural employment is in behavioral management of others.
 - the customer service skills of a customer service worker often, then the person's natural employment is as a customer service worker or manager.

** What do you find yourself complaining about?*

Complements & Likes:

How people complement and what people like about other people or places display their most natural employment.

- For example, if a person complements or likes:
 - another person on their hair, then the person's natural employment is as a hairstylist.
 - others on their health and wellness, then the person's natural employment is in health and wellness.
 - a business's decor, then the person's natural employment is in business decor.

** What compliments do you usually give others? What do you usually like about people or places (the qualities that you recognize as good)?*

Communication Arts, Like Figures of Speech:

The figures of speech, like similes and metaphors, descriptive adjectives, examples people give for complex topics while trying to explain them in a simpler way, and other forms of communication arts that people use in order to be creative in spoken or written communication displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person says:
 - “It’s a piece of cake,” then the person’s natural employment is in food.
 - “He eats like a pig,” then the person’s natural employment is in the food or with animals, maybe as a an animal feeder on a farm.
 - as an example to explain a complex topic, “It’s like you are a car and your wheels are turning but you are not going anywhere,” then the person’s natural employment is with car’s tires, say as a mechanic.

** What creative communications arts, like figures of speech, do you, or would you, use?*

Welcoming Guests:

How people welcome guests, like into their home, displays their own natural employment.

- For example, if a person just:
 - talks to their guests, then the person’s natural employment is with spoken communication and the specific employment with spoken communication depends on what the person actually talks about.

- cooks and serves food to their guests, then the person's natural employment is in a restaurant as a cook and food server.
- watches t.v with people, then the person's natural employment is in television and/or in whatever the person chooses to watch on the television.

** How do you welcome guests in your home?*

Events:

The events that people choose to attend, or set up themselves, display their own natural employment.

- For example, if a person goes to:
 - sporting events often, then the person's natural employment is in sports.
 - political rallies or other political events often, then the person's natural employment is in politics.
 - music concerts, then the person's natural employment is in music.

** What events do you go to or would you like to go to? What events do you set up or would you like to set up?*

Favorite & Best Subjects of Study:

What subjects people like to study the most and are best at, not just with book smarts but also when it comes to performing the actions like the real work environment (not just in school, but anywhere), shows their own natural employment.

- For example, if a person likes most to study:
 - languages, has the highest grades in it, and can speak and translate the language studied in everyday situations outside of a classroom, then the person's natural employment is in languages.
 - computer programming and does the best in school with grades in this subject, especially on the work assignments in the lab, then the person's natural employment is in computer programming.
 - social studies and does well in the application of its knowledge into real life situations, then the person's natural employment is in social studies.

** What is your favorite subject to study?*

Fashion Art:

The art people choose for clothing like the words or images on t-shirts or bags and the images on jewelry display their most natural employment. Also, what costumes they choose to wear for Halloween or costume parties displays their natural employment. An exception is when someone else gave them the artistic clothing to wear and they did not choose the artistic clothing themselves.

- For example, if a person wears a:
 - famous singer on their t-shirt, then the person's natural employment is in music.
 - butterfly or another insect as an earring or necklace, then the person's natural employment is with insects.
 - costume of a president for halloween, then the person's natural employment is as a president.

** What art is on, or would you put on, your clothing?*

** What do you or would you dress up as for Halloween or for a costume party?*

Internet Activities:

What people do the most online or like to do the most online displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - plays video games, mostly, then the person's natural employment is with video games.
 - spends their time trying to learning how to create online businesses, then the person's natural employment is in business.
 - assists with humanitarian crises, then the person's natural employment is with humanitarian crises.

** What do you do most often, or prefer to do online, in your free time?*

Innovative Ideas:

What people are more creative in is usually their most natural employment field. If people are told to create something new that they have never seen before or heard of, and they do it, that creation displays their natural employment field.

- For example, if a person creates an innovation in:
 - building structure, then the person's natural employment is in architecture.
 - law, then that person's natural employment is in law making.
 - cooking, then the person's natural employment is in cooking.

** What is something new, never created before, that you would create, if you could?*

Location of Housing & Work:

The closest businesses to where people live and work, or people choose to live and work, displays their natural employment. An exception for when the location does not display people's own natural employment is when the people did not choose their location for housing or work themselves, but someone else did for them, and they just went along.

- For example, if a person's location of:
 - home is closest to a gas station or convenience store, and not to other types of businesses, then the person's natural employment is in gas stations or in convenience stores.
 - work is closest to manual labor oriented businesses, and not other types of businesses, then the person's natural employment is in manual labor, in the same types of businesses nearby.
 - home and work is closest to the United Nation's building, and not to other types of businesses, then the person's natural employment is in a business like the United Nations.

** What businesses are nearby where you live? What businesses are nearby where you work?*

Friends', Neighbors', Family's Careers & Majors:

The careers and school majors of the people currently cordially closest to people (friend's neighbors, and family) are people's most natural employment, especially when they spend more time with those other people, or genuinely like them, and are the same age.

Exceptions for when friends', neighbors', and family's careers and majors don't match the people's own natural employment are when these people are non-close socially; don't get along

with them; live far away from and haven't contacted in a long time; when they are much older or younger and represent their future employment direction in life or their past, but not current; are just their own natural clients, bosses, or staff they meet in businesses they shop in instead of their co-workers. Other exceptions for neighbors is when the housing complex is a non-for-profit, instead of a for-profit, because in non-for-profits every socioeconomic class is placed in the same location for the first time outside of capitalism; or when the person has a temporary loss of income and has to live in a lower quality of housing for awhile, and thus have lower in class, lower levels of employment, neighbors than usual.

- For example, if a person's:
 - best friend is an actress, then the person's natural employment is as an actor or actress or in entertainment.
 - neighbor that they visit often, is in marketing, then that person's natural employment is in marketing or a similar profession.
 - sister, who they get along with and talk to almost every day, is majoring in engineering in university, then the person's probably natural employment is as an engineer too or something similar.

** What's the career or school major of your friends, neighbors, and family members that you currently speak to?*

Your Clients at Work & Your Co-Workers Past Employments:

The employment of a people's clients and of the past employments of their co-workers display their own natural employment. Especially, it shows whether people are naturally working in and/or with the lower, middle or upper class in society.

One exception can be when the clients and co-workers are older in age, and thus, have a possible future employment direction that people are not yet ready for or are younger and have/had employments that the person naturally had when they were younger but not now. Another exception can be when people don't get along well with certain clients and co-workers. And yet another exception is when a person has had a criminal arrest and needs to work in a different field and/or lower in class employment than before, say as a manual laborer.

- For example, if a person's:
 - clients are construction workers, electricians, maintenance workers, and other types of manual laborers in uniform, then the person's also natural employment is as a manual laborer.
 - co-workers past careers are teachers, life counselors, and similar middle class professions, then the person's natural employment is in those careers or in that same class of careers.
 - co-workers used to work, maybe as just interns, in political fields, and their clients mostly work in politics, then the person's natural employment is in politics.

* *What's your clients' careers and your co-workers' past careers?*

The Strangers People Meet:

The strangers people meet in public, in capitalism, and are willing to talk to or mingle with are usually in the same natural employment fields. Finding out what the strangers met in public do for a living helps people to know, and it also displays, their own natural employment. Especially, it shows whether people are naturally working in and/or with the lower, middle or upper class in society. This does not include people met in non-for-profits, because every class and employment will be there.

One exception is when people around them are older than them, and thus their employments are possible future life direction later in life when they will have more knowledge, but not a current natural employment or when people around them are younger than them, and thus, their employments are past natural employments that they had themselves when they were younger, but not now. Other exceptions are when people don't get along well with the stranger they meet; when the stranger is naturally a client, a boss or a worker in a business they would enter; or when people have a temporary loss in income and are in locations that are cheaper, and thus different than they would normally be; exited from capitalism and around people from every class that were found inside of capitalism; etc...

- For example, if a person meets a stranger in public who is employed as a (or strangers who are employed as):

- real estate agent and continues talking for a while, then the person meeting the stranger's natural employment is as a real estate agent also.
- owners of different middle class companies like life counseling companies, tourist companies, education companies, etc... then the person meeting the stranger's natural employment is an owner of such middle class types of companies.
- delivery driver, then the person's natural employment is as a delivery driver.

** What are the careers of the strangers you meet in public places or in your free time?*

Tourist Activities:

What people choose to do as tourists often displays their own natural employment.

- For example, if a person chooses to:
 - go to museums and study history, then the person's natural employment is in history or museums.
 - study city design, then the person's natural employment is in city design or urban planning.
 - eat in restaurants, then the person's natural employment is in restaurants.

** What activities do you do as a tourist?*

Activities with Children:

What activities people choose to do with their own or other people's children often displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person:

- reads books to children, the person's natural employment is in reading books.
- teaches the children something, then the person's natural employment is as a teacher in the same field that they teach the child.
- does fitness with them, then the person's natural employment is in fitness.

** What activities do you do, or do you like to do, with children?*

Advice to Others:

What advice people give to others for free displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person gives advice on:
 - parenting, then the person's natural employment is in parenting.
 - nutrition, then the person's natural employment is in nutrition.
 - hygiene advice, then the person's natural employment is in hygiene.

** What advice do you give others?*

Punishments & Rewards:

The ways that people punish or reward others displays their own natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - punishes someone by making them exercise, then the person's natural employment is in exercise

- punishes someone with hitting, then the person's natural employment is in career which involves hitting others
- rewards someone with food, then the person's natural employment is in food

** How do you punish others?*

** How do you reward others?*

The Objects in Hands & Found Directly Around:

The objects in hands and directly around people display their natural employment. This can include books, movies, computers, magazines, pens and pencils, notebooks, phones, radios, paintings, drawings, food & drinks, drinking mugs, posters, flyers, newspapers, clothing, bags, jewelry, furniture, etc... and the words and art on each of them. Exceptions, when the objects in hands and found directly around them are not someone's own natural employment are when someone else brought them to the location, someone else gave them the art or object as a gift, someone else decorated for them, they have a temporary loss in money and have to buy cheaper products (different products than they would usually buy) and shop in cheaper stores (different than the ones they would usually shop in), etc...

● For example, if a person is:

- sitting at a table with a romance novel in the hands, has the computer opened up to a dating website, on the computer's cover is a sticker of a man and a woman holding each other and kissing, on their screen saver of their phone is the image of a baby, on their coffee mug is the word 'love', and on the table is a parenting magazine, then the person is showing that their natural employment is in romance and baby making.
- carrying around with them a radio playing loud music for others to hear, then the person's probable natural employment is in music and in a career that is similar to the lyrics of the songs.
- standing next to a trash can, as the one spot in the room to stand, as opposed to next to the kitchen, the tv, the book shelf, or the pet dog, then the person's

probable natural employment is in cleaning.

** What do you often find in your hands and around you on display for others to see?*

Art on Technology:

Often people place art on their technology (vehicles, computers, phones, etc...) to display individuality and not just on their clothing or what not. This can include bumper stickers or window stickers on cars, desktop background for the computer screen, stickers on the back computer or phone that can be viewed by others, ringtones on the phone, and the like. What art people place on their technology displays their natural employment. An exception for when art on technology does not display natural employment is when someone else gave them the art or the technology itself, with the art on it already, and they did not choose the art or the technology themselves.

- For example, if a person has a:
 - sticker of a political organization on the back of their computer which replaced the logo already there, for others to see while they use their computer screen, then the person's probable natural employment is in politics.
 - screen saver on their computer of a soldier, then the person's natural employment is as a soldier.
 - background on their phone of an animal, then the person's natural employment is with animals.

** What do you, or would you, place on your car for art? On your computer as art? On your phone as art?*

Research Projects:

The research projects people choose to undertake, while in school, at work, or in their free time display their natural employment.

- For example, if a person chooses to research:
 - parking problems on campus for a psychology research course, then the person's natural employment is in parking.
 - people's natural employment in an unemployment center while they are also unemployed, then the person's naturally employed in employment coaching of the unemployed.
 - unreported crime in a city, then the person's natural employment is with crime.

* What research project would you like to start?

* What research projects did you choose to do recently, if any?

Naming Art:

How people artistically name different objects, people, projects, etc... display their natural employment.

- For example, if a person names:
 - or nicknames/pet names people pumpkin, sugar, or some other food word, then the person's natural employment is in food.
 - a military operation 'rainstorm' (and the operation does not involve a rainstorm), then the person's natural employment is with the weather.
 - a building a shape, like an oval or a pentagon, then the person's natural employment is with shapes like in geometry.

* What nicknames or pet names do you give to other people sometimes?

* What names do you, or would you, give to your pets?

* What names do you give, or have you given recently, to projects you start?

* What usernames do you use online?

Security & Defense:

The creativity people have when giving themselves security or defense, such as passwords and security questions and how they defend themselves physically, displays their natural employment.

● For example, if a person:

- often uses passwords with words related to entertainment, then the person's natural employment is in entertainment.
- chooses to use security questions online about family, then the person's natural employment is with family.
- buys a guard dog (and does nothing else for defense), then the person's natural employment is with animals.

* What passwords would you choose that you have not already used?

* What security questions do or would you choose to use so it is hard for others to access your accounts?

* How do you physically defend yourself or ensure your own physical safety?

The News:

What people like in the news and what stories they themselves would write about for or report to the news displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - likes most in the newspaper the life counseling section (like a ‘Dear Abby’), then the person’s natural employment is in life counseling
 - likes most the interviews with politicians on the t.v. news, then the person’s natural employment is with interviewing or talking to politicians.
 - wants to report to the news how bad a business is and how it is harming its clients, then the person’s natural employment is in business complaints.

* What news article topics do you enjoy reading the most?

* What’s your favorite part of the newspaper? _____

* What parts of the t.v. station or radio news do you enjoy the most?

* If you were to write a newspaper article or create a video for the news, what would the article or video be about?

* If you were to contact a newspaper or a news station with a story or complaint, what would the story or complaint be about?

The Careers of the People Liked:

People tend to like certain people and not others, wanting to be around them, and usually the one's they like most share their own natural employment. (There are exceptions, like when the person they like has a natural employment different from what they actually do for employment.)

- For example, if a person:
 - likes a bartender most, then the person's natural employment is as a bartender.
 - likes a military officer the most, then the person's natural employment is as a military officer.
 - likes a lawyer the most, then the person's natural employment is as a lawyer.

* When you like someone, what employments do they usually have?

Contentedness & Happiness:

What makes people content or happy displays their natural employment.

- For example, if a person:
 - is most content when in conversation with people, then the person's natural employment involves conversations with people.
 - is happiest while out in nature, then the person's natural employment is with nature.
 - is only content while writing, then the person's natural employment involves writing.

* What makes you the most content?

* What makes you happiest?

The Products & Services Bought:

The products and services people buy, especially the most often, displays their natural employment. Looking at following:

- what the products or services are used for
- which businesses sell or use those products or services inside their businesses
- which classes of people in general (manual labor, middle, or upper) usually buy the product or services, based on their quality. The upper class usually buy the higher quality in products (healthier, faster, more useful, etc...) and the lower in class usually buy the lower in class products (unhealthier, slower, less useful, etc...)
- what art is shown on the product like its name, logo, slogan, or advertisement (See the related section, 'Artistic Qualities of Products & Businesses' also)

helps to know which careers are associated with the products and services bought.

Exceptions include when the person has a temporary loss in income and can't buy the products and services that they would usually buy but cheaper ones and only ones of certain kinds, like food; when they are buying requested products for someone else that they normally wouldn't buy themselves; or when someone else bought the products or services for them that they currently have.

- **For example, if a person buys:**
 - home decor often, then the person's natural employment is in home decor.
 - clothing often, then the person's natural employment is in clothing.

- higher quality products like the healthiest foods, the most expensive and fastest transportation (like airplane and helicopter instead of bus transportation), and products with art on them which is political, then the person's natural employment is in the more upper class professions.

** What products do you buy the most often? What products do you enjoy shopping for? What quality do they usually have (high, medium, or low)? What art is shown on those products (their names, logos, advertisements, etc...)?*

The Businesses Shopped In:

The businesses people shop in, or enter, often displays their natural employment. Looking at following:

- what actual products and services that are sold in the business
- the careers (and socioeconomic class) of the customers in the business
- the quality of the products and services in the business: the healthiest, fastest, most useful, etc... products and services are usually bought by the higher in class people and the unhealthiest, slowest, etc... products and services are usually bought by the lowest in class people
- what other businesses are nearby
- the art inside and outside of the business itself like the name, logo, slogan, art on the walls, songs, and advertisements and the art on the products the business sells (See the related section 'Artistic Qualities of Products & Businesses' also)
- the university or college degrees and former careers of the staff inside

helps to know which careers are associated with the businesses shopped in.

- For example, if a person shops in, or enters, a:
 - mall the most often, the person's most likely natural employment is in retail.
 - restaurant with the most unhealthy, cheapest foods and where a high percentage of the customers are dressed in manual labor uniforms, then the person's likely natural employment is in manual labor.
 - hotel with a political name and with images of the government buildings surrounding the hotel and the actual politicians on the walls, then the person's likely natural employment is in government, inside the same government buildings displayed on the walls.

Exceptions include when someone else chose the business and/or area (city or area of the city) for them, they have a temporary loss in money and entered a business they normally would not have entered, etc...

* What businesses do you shop in, or enter, often? What products and services are sold in them? What is the quality of the products and services: high, medium, or low? Which customers shop there? What other businesses are nearby? What is the art inside the business itself and of its products?

Artistic Qualities of Products & Businesses:

Oftentimes, the names, logos, slogans, and advertising of products and businesses have nothing to do with the actual products or businesses themselves, but are simply artistic. Also, often businesses, interior & exterior design (like the art on the walls or windows) and the music have nothing to do with the businesses products or services. There are so many products and businesses to choose from, and it is rare for the art to actually match the products and businesses.

And with all this artistic choice, the artistic names, logos, slogans, advertising, etc... of the products bought and the businesses shopped in often display people's natural employment.

Exceptions include if people are buying products or entering businesses that someone else chose and not the ones they choose, or they have a temporary loss in income and have to choose cheaper products and businesses than they normally would, with different art on them than they prefer.

● For example, if a person:

- buys a food product with the name '330' with the logo of an animal, and the advertising a picture of a soldier, then the person's natural employment with numbers (or math), animals, and military.
- shops in a supermarket called presidential foods, and on the walls are paintings of different presidents of the past, and on the windows are paintings of different president's first ladies of the past, and it sells products like a beer with the art on it presidents of the past, then the person's natural employment is in national politics working as or directly with or as a president.
- Wears shoes with the name brand 'Sport' showing on them and a shirt with the tag showing the name brand of 'Old Navy', then the person's probable natural employment is in sports and military.

** What are some of the names, logos, slogans, and special advertising used on the products you buy?*

** What are some of the names, logos, slogans, advertising, interior and exterior designs, songs, of the businesses you choose to shop in?*

The Businesses People Stay Near:

The businesses that people tend to stay near even when they do not go inside of them display their natural employment. This includes when people go to the park, sit on a bench on the sidewalk, use other businesses, sleep in hotels or apartments, or volunteer, study or work near.

An exception is when the person did not choose to live, work, or spend their free time near those businesses, but someone else.

- For example, if a person:
 - is homeless, without money, and must sleep and beg on the sidewalk or in a park day and overnight and chooses to sleep and beg directly in front of restaurants, then the person's likely natural employment is in a restaurant.
 - is almost always found nearby fitness parks like a children's playground and ball sports fields, where they live, work, or socialize with other people, then the person's natural employment is in fitness of those types.
 - mostly around the government legislature and policy institutes throughout the day and night, then the person's natural employment is in politics.

The Products People would Create:

If people are told to create a new product, anything that they can think of, the product that they choose to create displays their natural field of employment.

- For example, if a person creates a new:
 - drink, then the person's natural employment is in food & drinks.
 - city, then the person's natural employment is in the city building or planning.
 - children's toy, then the person's natural employment is with children's toys.

** What new product would you create if you could?*

The Businesses People would Create:

If people are told to create a new business, any business that they can think of, the business that they choose to create displays their natural employment field.

- For example, if a person creates a:
 - technological innovation company then the person's natural employment is in technological innovation.
 - dating business, then the person's natural employment is in the field of dating.
 - life coaching company, then the person's natural employment is as a life coach.

** What new business would you create if you could?*

The Art Surrounding Them:

Art is almost always surrounding people, no matter where they go, displaying the truth about their natural employment, often contrary to actual employment. Art displaying natural employment can be at home, at work, on products bought or used, in businesses shopped in, etc... It can be on the walls as paintings or photos; on the t.v. as t.v. shows or movies; on the radio as songs; on a table or stand being used by them or others; on people's clothing as images or words; on the book shelves and C.D. racks; on the products around as names, logos, or special advertisements; in the speech of the people around; etc... The art can be varied, displaying many different natural employment fields or all the same and displaying only one natural employment. And if one took photos or videos of people, the truth, of people's natural employment, via art, would be obvious for all to see and hear later.

Exceptions, when the art is not someone's own natural employment are when someone else brought them to the location, someone else gave them the art as a gift, someone else decorated for them, they have a temporary loss in money and have to buy cheaper products (different products than they would usually buy) and shop in cheaper stores (different than the ones they would usually shop in), etc...

- For example, if a person is:
 - at home with friends or family and a t.v. show about restaurant owners is on, books on display are about cooking and gardening, with the walls having food and flowers on them along with their own family, with products having logos of plants or animals on them, in their hands is a magazine about healthy eating, and the conversation is about food, then the person's natural employment is in field.

- in a business with news on the t.v. showing the president giving a speech, with newspapers on the tables and in stands, with the walls having political figures on them, the name of the business being political, the names of the products being political, the songs on the radio being political, etc, then the person's natural employment is in politics.
- at work, and on their work desk is a drinking cup with the words "keep praying," and on their wall is a wall calendar that has sports on it, then the person's natural employment is with a church and in sports.

** What art tends to be surrounding you, no matter where you are?*

The People Surrounding Them:

People tend to be surrounded by people in their own natural employment and class (lower, middle, or upper), no matter where they are: at home, at work, in a business when they go shopping, or in whatever place that they go in their free time. (This is not the case in non-for-profits, where every socioeconomic class enters.) And what employment most of these people tend to have around them, especially the ones who initiate conversations or friendships and the person gets along with, are what their natural employment are.

One exception is when people around them are older than them, and thus their employments are possible future life direction later in life when they will have more knowledge, but not a current natural employment or when people around them are younger than them, and thus, their employments are past natural employments that they had themselves when they were younger, but not now. Other exceptions are when the people can be the clients, bosses, and workers of businesses that the people naturally enter, instead, but usually they will not get along well as co-workers/friends if this is the case; when they don't get along with those people; or when someone else brought the person to the location where the people are around them are or someone else brought the people surrounding them, where they did not have a choice to where the person is; when people have a temporary loss in income and have to be in places cheaper, and thus, different from where they normally would be; when people are exited from capitalism and the people around them are from every socioeconomic class that exists inside of capitalism; etc...

● For example, if a person:

- goes to a party at a friends' or neighbors' house, and is surrounded by people who have employments like fire fighter, police man, EMT, security guard, combat soldier, and other middle class helping professions (which don't require a university degree), then the

person's probable natural employment is in one of those types of middle class professions.

- is sitting in a cafe and is surrounded by politicians, military, professors and students at a political university nearby, and such professions that are considered more upper in class, then the person's also natural employment is in those professions and in professions of similar class.
- goes shopping and initiates a conversation with others, and discovers that the other people are lower in class workers such as janitors, maintenance workers, electricians, carpenters, etc... then the person's probable natural employment is in the lower in class in a profession similar to those.

** What careers do the people who tend to surround you have, no matter where you are?*

The Art that People Create:

The art that people create, whether it is a short story, a poem or song, movies, t.v. shows, novels, video games, paintings, sculptures, etc... displays their natural employment.

● For example, if a person:

- writes a novel about being a spy, then the person's natural employment is as a spy.
- paints a flower, then the person's natural employment is with flowers.
- sings a song about seeking justice, then the person's natural employment is in the field of justice.

** What movie scripts, t.v. show scripts, or novels do you or would you write? What is the main character's employment? What does the main character go through in life, or what is the synopsis or plot of the movie?*

* What video game or board game do you or would you make?

* What songs do you or would you write and sing?

* What painting would you paint?

* What do you or would you draw?

* What sculptures do or would you sculpt?

* What photo(s) do or would you take?

* What video(s) do or would you shoot?

* What characters do you or would you act out in a play, a skit, an improv, a game of charades, etc...?
