Woman dies in police chase ELKHORN - A Pleasant Prairie woman was killed in a crash Saturday night in Walworth County.

According to a Walworth County Sheriff's Department news release, a deputy saw a vehicle traveling at 76 miles per hour in a 55 mile per hour zone at about 11:55 p.m. on Highway 120. The vehicle, a Pontiac Grand Am, came to the intersection of Highway 120 and 11, made an abrupt right hand turn, and sped away westbound on Highway 11. The deputy followed on Highway 11 as the vehicle headed toward Interstate 43 in Lafayette Township.

Shortly after, the deputy found the Grand Am had failed to make a curve and rolled over several times. The car was in the ditch on fire. The owner and alleged driver, Jessica N. Maniero, 19, was pulled out of the car and Walworth County Coroner John Griebel pronounced her dead at the scene, according to the release.

Her passenger, Daniel R. Taylor, 23, of Kenosha, was taken to Lakeland Medical Center where he was treated and released. Taylor was wearing a seat belt and Maniero was not.

An autopsy is scheduled.
