Hello 4th Grade Families!

Happy Friday! Field day was so fun - thank you to those who volunteered! Here is a quick snapshot of what we covered this week:

Eureka 4: (Grade 4, Module 4)

- **Lesson 1:** Identify and draw points, lines, line segments, rays, and angles. Recognize them in various contexts and familiar figures.
- **Lesson 2:** Use right angles to determine whether angles are equal to, greater than, or less than right angles. Draw right, obtuse, and acute angles.
- **Lesson 3:** Identify, define, and draw perpendicular lines.
- **Lesson 4:** Identify, define, and draw parallel lines.

Eureka 4/5: (Grade 5, Module 1 and 2)

- Lesson 16: Lesson 16: Solve word problems using decimal operations.
- End of Module 1 Assessment
- **Lesson 1:** Multiply multi-digit whole numbers and multiples of 10 using place value patterns and the distributive and associative properties.
- **Lesson 2:** Estimate multi-digit products by rounding factors to a basic fact and using place value patterns.

ELC:

- We read "Letting Swift River Go," and made inferences
- Our word work focused on "sub"
- In writing, we started digging deep to develop a thesis about a character for a literary essay

Benchmark:

- We began Unit $7 \rightarrow$ How do communities evolve?
 - We read "Rail Tycoon" and compared information given in text versus information provided in a timeline.
- We explored diphthongs

Social Studies:

 We continued talking about the Maryland Government and the roles of the different branches

All 4th graders will have nightly math and reading homework. We encourage you to set up a homework spot in your home that is stocked with pencils so

that your 4th grader is ready to review the day's math concepts. Your child should be reading 20 minutes every night. Math homework goes along with the eureka lessons listed above. Any homework assigned in Science, Social Studies, or Health will be assigned at the teachers discretion.
