~Rules~

- ❖ Parts **MUST** be 1920x1080
- ❖ AMV or PMV is allowed - just make sure there are no still frames
- ❖ You will have **1 MONTH** to complete your part! Extensions can be granted if you need one! This is meant to be a fun MAP so no pressure!!
- ❖ Have fun and get creative! Take inspiration from your favorite Victorian art, book, movie, etc!
- ❖ Make sure your idea matches the mood of the song - if the part of the song you're using is softer, then use a more calm scene, but if the part of the song you're using is loud and aggressive, then use a more dramatic scene!
- ❖ You can use any character designs you'd like!
- ❖ No watermarks please! Greenscreen is allowed
- ❖ Please be careful cutting your audio - it's always better to cut it a bit longer than you need
- ❖ The codeword is which characters and scene you'll be using!
- ❖ You may ask for up to 2 parts!
- ❖ Asking for multiple parts in order of preferences increases your chances of getting a part!
- ❖ You **MUST** join the Discord server!

Men's Victorian Fashion

Dickens Costume 1840-1860

Cravat / Tie
Cravat or Ascot necktie in small prints, paisley, or dots. Rich colors.

Top Hat
Tall black silk top hat or worst felt equivalent with curled brim.

Coat
Black, brown, or green frock coat or tailcoat (morning coat was the preferred style of middle and upper class men).

Vest
Single or double breasted vest in stripes, paisley or solid bold colors.

Slack Waist Pants
High waisted flat front pants in black, tan, grey or light colored. Keep up with buttons on suspenders.

Boots
Black or brown lace up boots with low heel and polished toe.

Men's early to mid Victorian clothing was a clash of colors and patterns in day wear. Narrow lap, high waist pants were often bold plaids and stripes against a paisley vest and necktie. The more proper gentlemen kept his colors simple and his tailcoat tightly fitted. Tall lace up boots complement the overall slim silhouette. A top hat added height while a walking cane was both a fine accessory and a weapon. A man would never leave his home without a pair of clean gloves, his pocket watch or shirt collar freshly pressed. While there are some Victorian reproduction clothing available today you can also use well chosen modern clothes to create an affordable Victorian look. Learn more at
